

We are happy to share that we have just arranged a very special opportunity in Cape Town to honor Archbishop Desmond Tutu. He will join us on board for a short program on April 4.

Tutu was the first black African to serve as Archbishop of Cape Town, and his work forging racial equality is renowned throughout the world. Beginning with his opposition to apartheid in South Africa, he dedicated his life to working tirelessly to spread peace, freedom, justice and democracy around the globe. His leadership of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission has offered a blueprint to nations across the globe seeking to recover from war, conflict and brutality. The Archbishop is known for his unshakable optimism in the face of overwhelming odds and his limitless faith in the ability of people to do good works. Over the last decade and a half he has been an outspoken voice for women's leadership, girls' education and LGBT rights, addressing climate change and seeking to end the practice of child brides.

Tutu received the Nobel Peace Prize in 1984, the Albert Schweitzer Prize for Humanitarianism in 1986, the Pacem in Terris Award in 1987, the Sydney Peace Prize in 1999, the Gandhi Peace Prize in 2007 and the United States Presidential Medal of Freedom in 2009.

The Archbishop and his wife, Leah, founded the Desmond and Leah Tutu Legacy Foundation in Cape Town and the Desmond Tutu Peace Foundation in New York, a nonprofit organization engaging and equipping young people to be peacemakers and change agents.

Holland America Line president Orlando Ashford will present Archbishop Tutu with our first Shared Humanity Award in recognition of a lifetime championing equality and peace. As a company, we firmly believe that travel has the power to change the world by building connections between people, and we are extremely proud to play a role in helping our guests experience different cultures around the world.

The program will include remarks by Orlando Ashford and Robert V. Taylor, resident of the Desmond Tutu Peace Foundation in New York and author of A New Way to Be Human. Robert is a South African native and a longtime friend and colleague of Archbishop Tutu. The Archbishop will be in attendance but will not be speaking at this event.
