Which Shore Excursions Are Right for You?

Choose the tours that interest you by using the icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the tours best suited to your physical capabilities. These icons will help you to interpret this brochure.



Moderate Activity: Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.

Strenuous Activity: Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.

Panoramic Tours: Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these tourss offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation from the vehicle during the tour. As vehicles outside the United States are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace is gentle and taking your time is encouraged.

Limited Capacity: The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or the need to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants in order to operate.

Snack: This tour includes a small snack or tasting of local specialties. The snack is not a meal.

Meal: This tour includes a meal—lunch on daytime tours, dinner on evening tours.



Frequently Asked Questions

What should I wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all shore excursions. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

What about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

How will I know what time each tour departs?

The on-board Shore Excurions Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your shore excursions tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at hollandamerica.com.

I am traveling with friends. Can we be accommodated on the same motorcoach?

The departure location for each tour is printed on

your shore excursions tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.

To allow our Shore Excursions Managers flexibility to coordinate your time in port with meals and activities on the ship, exact departure times are published in the Shore Excursions Order Form on board. I have a disability. How do I know which tours will best suit me?

The tours are graded according to the relative level of activity they entail. The activity icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please see page 1 for specific information or speak to a Shore Excursions specialist (1.888.425.9376). It is important to keep in mind that tour operators are subject to the laws of their own country with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States.

Will I encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship when it's in port?

Please see the on-board Shore Excursions staff to help determine whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. The decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain, made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety. We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

Avalon Underwater Park Snorkel Adventure

Departs: 11:00 AM Approximately 5 Hours Adult \$299.95; Child \$249.95

Stand on the hallowed grounds of the Pearl Harbor battlefield as you learn the incredible in-depth history behind the events of December 7, 1941. This exclusive behind-thescenes experience is not available to the general public.

Visit the hangars that withstood the attack, still marked with bullet holes, and enjoy a guided tour of the **Pearl Harbor Aviation Museum**.

Your outing includes exclusive access to the historic **Ford Island Control Tower**, not open to the public.

See video of American and Japanese aircraft engaged in aerial combat as you hear about the little-known, but extremely harrowing, battle that took place over the small Hawaiian island of Niihau. It is the story of a determined Japanese pilot and the Hawaiian heroes that thwarted his escape. Learn of the historic C-47 and B-17 known as the Swamp Ghost.

You will stand on the Surrender Deck of the **USS** *Missouri* , where World War II finally ended. Hear the story and see the impact of the *kamikaze* attack on the Mighty Mo.

Enjoy the **North Shore** led by a guide who will provide interesting and fun information about Hawaii's birds, plants, geology, geography and history throughout your adventure.

From the cruise ship pier you will drive to the Valley of the Temples.

Visit the picturesque **Byodo Temple**, located at the base of the stunning 2,000-foot lush green cliffs of the Koolau Mountain Range.

Travel north along the scenic shoreline past Chinaman's Hat and Kahana Bay to Kahuku, home of the North Shore shrimp farms.

Stop for lunch to try some delicious locallyfarmed garlic shrimp, fish or a chicken plate.

After **lunch**, a short drive will bring you to beautiful **Sunset Beach**, famous for towering surf during the winter months and hosts many international surf contests.

The picturesque Waimea Valley terminates at one of the world's finest big-wave surfing beaches. Continue on to **Haleiwa Beach Park** -- one of many surf breaks on the North Shore that make up a strip of what many surfers call "the seven-mile miracle".

Due to the specialized nature of some lift-equipped vehicles, priority is given to guests using a wheelchair and one companion only; additional companions may be required to travel on the transportation provided for tour Germaine's Luau. Bookings not marked with an accessibility requirement will be removed from the tour's inventory.

The lift on the vehicle can accommodate a maximum weight of 600lbs. This tour can accommodate lightweight manual and collapsible wheelchairs. Due to the terrain at the venue, motorized wheelchairs are not accessible.

Iconic Diamond Head Adventure Hike



Departs: Noon Approximately 3½ Hours Price \$129.95

This exciting, fun and educational tour of the world-famous **Diamond Head Crater** begins with a short introductory talk by your guide. Learn about the fascinating volcanic creation of Diamond Head, Hawaiian history, European discovery, the origin of the famous name, and modern-day military use of the Gibraltar of the Pacific.

Set out with your guide on a **walk** to the 763foot **summit of Diamond Head**. Along the way you will stop at several points to rest and photograph the crater.

Walking up stairways, entering a dark **200foot tunnel** and climbing a **spiral staircase** impart a sense of adventure.

Upon reaching the summit you will encounter an incredible **panoramic view of Waikiki Beach**, the emerald-green mountains and the sparkling aquamarine water of the Pacific Ocean below. Enjoy the scenery at the summit for 20 minutes then you'll stroll back to the crater floor.

You will also learn about Hawaii's native bird and plant species.

Notes:

Wear comfortable walking shoes. Bring a hat

and sunscreen. Minimum age is 5 years. Tour does not operate on holidays. Participants are required to walk on uneven but maintained paths, negotiate a lighted, 235-foot-long tunnel, and climb two steep stairways (77 steps and 99 steps respectively) to reach the summit of Diamond Head. The round trip walk is approximately 1½ miles and features an elevation gain of 561 feet.

Oahu's Scenic Shores



Departs: 11:00 AM, 1:00 PM Approximately 4 Hours Adult \$89.95; Child \$69.95

Encounter the abundant gifts of nature and tumultuous volcanic past that have shaped the **Oahu** of today. An experienced guide accompanies you on this unique journey of discovery.

After traversing the busy **city of Honolulu**, proceed directly to the crater at **Diamond Head**. Hear captivating stories about the origins and history of this world-famous landmark, while standing within its extinct volcanic crater.

Journey along the southern coast past **Hanauma Bay**, created by ancient eruption, as your guide explains the bay's origins and history.

Travel past the famous Halona Point blowhole, where seawater pushing through a volcanic vent erupts in a large and loud fountain. Keep a close watch for the giant humpback whales that occasionally frequent these waters.

Continue past the Makapu'u Lookout, with its incredible panoramic views. Learn about this area's volcanic origins, as your expert guide points out its many interesting bird and plant species.

Make a refreshment stop for an exclusive Lava Dole Whip, included with your tour. Enjoy some shopping and a rest room break if needed.

A stop at the **Pali Lookout** high in the **Koolau Mountains** provides a grand finale. Although the terrain is often windswept and cloudcovered, the views are nonetheless magnificent.

Pearl Harbor on Your Own & City **Sights**



Departs: 1:00 PM Approximately 4 Hours

Price \$69.95

The sights and sounds of December 7th, 1941 come alive on this self-guided visit to Pearl **Harbor** where you can explore at your leisure. You'll also enjoy a **narrated tour** of downtown Honolulu with a photo stop.

During the drive to Pearl Harbor your driver sets the stage on the history of this historical attraction and point out significant places along the way.

Once you're at Pearl Harbor, your driver will escort you into the Pearl Harbor Visitor's Center and brief you on all of the activities in the park including the center's many exhibits, multimedia re-enactments and replicas, the Road to War Museum, the Attack Gallery and free time on the park grounds. You'll have three hours to explore and may try to get a walk-up ticket to the Arizona Memorial or visit the USS Missouri (additional fee). Don't miss the gift shop for one-of-a-kind mementos, books, flags that were flown on the Pearl Harbor National Memorial and other interesting items.

The experience continues as you visit downtown Honolulu. Your guide will craft a story rooted in history as you tour through the city, sharing anecdotes that paint a picture of living in Honolulu during WWII. Pass by Iolani Palace, the State Capitol, King Kamehameha Statue, Aloha Tower and various other points of interest on your way back to the pier with a **photo stop** included in the heart of the city.

Notes:

This tour does not include the visit to the Arizona Memorial. Guests may try to obtain a walk-up ticket to the Arizona Memorial, which are limited and available on a firstcome, first-served basis. The Arizona Memorial experience is 75-minutes long and your time at Pearl Harbor is 3 hours (all of which is free time). If you can secure tickets, it will have to work within the parameters of the allotted time as the bus must leave at the designated departure time and guests who do not make it back will have to find their own

transportation back to the ship.

Security measures prohibit items such as backpacks, fanny packs, camera bags, and purses in the memorial. Limited storage is available at the memorial for a small fee and no personal items may remain on the bus. Strollers are not allowed in the movie theater, on the Navy shuttle boat or on the USS Arizona Memorial. Swimsuits and tank tops are not permitted at the Arizona Memorial.

Waikiki Beach Break



Departs: 12:30 PM Approximately 4½ Hours Price \$119.95

Enjoy a carefree morning or afternoon on world-famous Waikiki Beach -- the birthplace of surfing, while soaking up views of the iconic Diamond Head Crater. This relaxing and fun-filled beach break is only a short ride away from the cruise ship pier.

Upon arrival at Waikiki, you will be escorted to your beach set -- a shared umbrella and a chaise lounge. Relax oceanside, in a VIP section of the Duke Kahanamoku Lagoon adjacent to the legendary Hilton Hawaiian Village.

A variety of surfboards, stand-up paddleboards and boogie boards are also available for rent at your own expense -- you may wish to try your hand at surfing, stand up paddle boarding or take a ride on an outrigger canoe -- a sport endemic to Polynesia.

Return to the dock via the transportation provided or those who wish to stay at the beach independently are welcome to do so, but must make their own way back to the ship.

Notes:

Absolutely no alcohol is allowed on the beach. Wear your swimsuit under your clothing; bring a towel, sunscreen and a hat. Be vigilant with your personal belongings while on the beach.

Waikiki Sunset & Cocktail Cruise



Departs: 5:15 PM 3 Hours Adult \$129.95: Child \$99.95

Take in a beautiful sunset on a relaxing cruise that travels along Oahu's famed Waikiki **coastline**. Upon arrival on **Taha'a**, board a **4-wheel-drive vehicle** and head to the valleys and mountains of the island. Your guide will point out sights along the way. You'll stop at a beautiful viewpoint and learn the traditional uses of local plants and trees. Sample various local fruits and learn tamure -- typical Tahitian dancing.

The drift will be done up to three times (time permitting). Participants must be extremely comfortable in the water as snorkeling takes place in very shallow water and through a current that can be very strong. You have to follow the valleys through the coral to avoid touching the coral formations, as doing so can lead to injuries.

The area teems with a spectacular variety of tropical fish and amazing corals. The richness of this coral garden is unique in Polynesia -- snorkelers will enjoy a very rewarding experience.

See how the popular pareo is made, learn about tupa crabs, taste locally-grown fruits and see relics left behind by the US military after World War II. Admire the ever-changing colors of Bora Bora's world-famous lagoon, and discover tropical flowers and trees among the dense green vegetation on the mountainside.

A **panoramic drive** takes you around the whole island and allows you to enjoy the impressive view of central Mount Otemanu, standing at more than 2,400 feet tall and dominating the landscape. It overlooks the turquoise lagoon and its beautiful crown of coral islands.

Pass along the east coast of Bora Bora -- site of many famous resorts. Matira Point boasts the prettiest sandy beach on the island. You'll stop at the famous Bloody Mary's restaurant for a chance to take photos before returning to the pier.

See from a distance the famous Motu Tapu, and enjoy the view of Mt Otemanu and the pristine waters surrounding you. A stop in clear water will allow you to enjoy a **swim** and some **snorkeling**. Look for stingrays as these graceful creatures are often seen in the area --you may be lucky enough to enjoy a beautiful encounter with them.

Continue your ride through gorgeous scenery and approach the reef where you will learn about the formation of this incredible island. A short stop on a **sand bank** will be an opportunity for refreshments.

Participants should be accustomed to wearing

Glass-Bottom Boat Adventure

In the shallows near the reef, small brilliantly colored fish dart through the water and anemones dance to the rhythm of the currents.

Notes:

This is an easy tour with only a few steps down to board the boat. Suitable for guests with mobility limitations. Wildlife sightings are likely but are not guaranteed.

Motu Islet Lagoon Cruise & Beach Break

Reaching the *motu* (coral islet), you're all set for a typical **island beach break** -- about 90 minutes of sunbathing and swimming in crystal clear water. You'll enjoy refreshments on the atoll.

This relaxing trip is a great opportunity for souvenir photos, as it offers some superb views of the hidden, eastern side of Bora Bora. Lagoon navigation, snorkeling and free time on the beach -- what a great way to enjoy your day on Bora Bora!

Notes:

There are some stairs involved. While the *motu* area used is privately rented, guests are not entitled to venture outside of the property limits. For your own safety and to preserve the environment, do not touch or step on

Dolphin Watching Expedition

Join marine biologist Dr Michael Poole or his assistant on this ecotourism and research project on wild, free-ranging dolphins. Dr Poole has been studying dolphins in French Polynesia since 1987. Spinner dolphins, rough-tooth dolphins and pilot whales are seen around Moorea, with spinner dolphins regularly coming inside the reef.

With a little luck, as you set out by **boat**, you will see schools of acrobatic spinner dolphins while an excellent commentary provides details on the remarkable life and society of these wonderful mammals. Learn about the geology of French Polynesia while viewing the dramatic beauty of Moorea from the water. Dolphins are found on 95% of the tours, but the thoroughness of the explanations and the sheer magnificence of **Moorea's coastline** will ensure a rewarding time for all, even on those few occasions when no dolphins are found.

Between July and the beginning of November, there is the additional chance of viewing the humpback whales that maintain a seasonal presence to mate and calf here.

The tour operator follows international ecotourism guidelines and is an active contributor to the conservation of French Polynesia's dolphins and whales. Participation in this tour will help to further this goal.

Notes:

Time permitting, you can enjoy an optional swim stop at the end of the tour. This requires a water entry directly from the boat and is not a swim with the dolphins. Motu Beach Picnic & Ray Feeding

Your experience begins when you board a comfortable, covered, **motorized boat**. You will have the pleasure of admiring the island from the lagoon just as the first explorers did in the 18th century. The old crater of the volcano provides a view to unique and magnificent scenery-sharp peaks and high mountains, green valleys, pineapple plantations and lush forests. As you ride across the turquoise waters of Moorea, the captain will tell you all about the island's legends. You will then arrive at one of the gorgeous, white sandy islets surrounded by crystal clear water, shallow enough to walk right off the boat onto the beach. **Swim** or

snorkel around the turquoise lagoon or simply relax on the beach or in the shade while the local crew prepares lunch. One of the highlights will be when the local guides attract schools of sting rays from the lagoon. You are welcome to join in and play with these gentle sea creatures. In exchange for a piece of fish they will gracefully dance around you. A delicious buffet-style lunch is served, with soft island music in the background. After lunch you will be entertained with more music and a coconut husking demonstration. Transfer by motorized catamaran back to the ship.

Set sail on the 65-foot maxi-catamaran Ohana -- perhaps the largest and fastest catamaran of its class on Polynesian waters. Ohana offers plenty of shaded seating under the canopy, while sun seekers can relax on the two large nets located in the bow. Thanks to its short draft, you will be amazed where your maxi catamaran can take you -- shallow lagoon waters and close-up views of the shore are the norm.

Get your hands on the wheel while the crew sets up the sails for magnificent sailing along the in-shore reef. Feel the sea breeze as you discover the lush and appealing scenery of Moorea. Cross the reef through the passage and see an amazing mix of blue and green water, overwater bungalows and local houses -- the stuff of gorgeous photos.

At a **swim** stop, a mask and **snorkel** are provided. Access to the water is made by way of a large, easy step ladder that makes getting into and out of the water a snap. This sandy area boasts tiki carved stones, which are worth a visit.

Back on board, settle on the catamaran decks or nets, and relax with **refreshments** while you sail your way home through the bay of 'the lizard isle'. Keep your eyes peeled for

Discover Tahiti's West Coast



Departs: 7:30 AM, 12:30 PM Approximately 4 Hours Adult \$129.95; Child \$104.95

Begin your tour with a drive to the local Government Assembly headquarters. Here you will visit the private **garden** -- a lush setting with a natural spring pool that was a favorite of Queen Pomare IV (1827-1877).

Leaving the city of Papeete, head along the West Coast of the island of Tahiti, turning south to the **Vaipahi Gardens**. Rare species of precious wood and tropical flowers flourish here.

On the return route, enjoy a stop at the **Fern Grotto Caves** of Maraa. These caves were described in Captain Cook's 1769 journal and were also a popular bathing spot for painter Paul Gauguin on hot afternoons, as described in his book, *Noa Noa*.

Visit the **Arahurahu Marae** and take a short walk through this quite sacred place, which served both religious and social purposes in pre-Christian Polynesian societies.

Your last stop will include a short **walk** to the **Tahara Viewpoint**. Your guide will allow you some time here to appreciate view and snap a few photos.

Board a **4x4 vehicle** for a great adventure deep into the unspoiled interior of Tahiti. You will head towards the east coast, passing by the island coastal road and through bustling Papeete.

In the **Papenoo Valley**, watch for cascading waterfalls, luxuriant tropical vegetation and exotic flowers, and discover an array of unspoiled treasures. Bring your camera to capture the beauty of the scenery and the views from this valley -- a great respite for nature-lovers.

Time permitting, you may be able to take a refreshing **swim** in a river along the way.

Wear your swimsuit under your clothing; bring a towel, sunscreen, a hat, insect repellent, sunglasses, and bottle of water. Expensive jewelry or clothing should not be worn on tour. Feel the sea spray on your face as the boat slices along the barrier reef. Watch for spinner dolphins, frequently seen in the area. On the south shore of Taapuna Passage keep an eye out for local and international surfers hanging ten and catching waves. Drop anchor in clear waters inside the lagoon, where you will have plenty of time to enjoy a **swim and snorkel**. Gear is provided. Access to the water is made by a

large, easy stepladder. Towel off and settle in on the catamaran deck and nets. Kick back, unwind and enjoy a **refreshment** as you sail through turquoise waters on the way home.

Head towards the east coast, where your first stop will be at **Point Venus**. This is the historic landing site for the European discoverers and evangelists that came to the Society Islands in the 1700s. It boasts the only lighthouse on the island, which was built in 1867.

Continue south, passing steep coastline, until you reach the **Gauguin Restaurant**, where you'll stop for a refreshment.

At the **Spring Garden of Vaipahi**, rare species of precious wood and tropical flowers grow in

luxuriant splendor.

A short photo stop at the famous Papara surf beach offers views of one of the nicest blacksand beaches on Tahiti. When the surf's up, it's a favorite with the locals.

The drive back to the pier takes you along the west coast, completing your full island drive around Tahiti-Nui.

Nearby you will find Point Venus. This is where Captain James Cook observed the transit of Venus in 1769, and the only lighthouse of the island was built here in 1867.

Lunch is served at the Gauguin Restaurant (or

similar); then, continue on to the **Spring Garden of Vaipahi**, brimming with tropical plants and trees.

Last but not least, explore the interesting **Museum of Tahiti & Her Islands**, located in Punaauia, on the west coast of Tahiti. The museum displays a large array of archeological finds, Polynesian artwork and costumes that tell the story of ancient Tahiti.

Taiohae, Nuku Hiva, French Polynesia - Saturday, March 26, 2022: Wild and untamed, born of

volcanic fire, these isles are the ancient home of architect-builders who created great *me'ae* (ceremonial walls) - and today home to tattooists, sailors and sculptors. Step ashore to discover French Polynesia at its pristine, natural best.

Taipivai Valley: Scenic Drive

Departs: 8:30 AM, 12:30 PM 3 Hours Price \$139.95

Taipivai Valley was originally made famous by the American writer and sailor, Herman Melville (1819-1891), who deserted his ship and hid in this valley. Captured by the indigenous natives, he lived there for three weeks -- a period during which he observed their way of life. This experience enabled him to write the novel called *Typee*. This landmark was more recently made famous by being the base camp for the *Survivor* television show filmed here in 2001.

An on-road **panoramic drive** will lead you through lush vegetation among valleys and great viewpoints. The coastline of this part of the island is breathtaking and ensures you some time for rewarding pictures.

You will pass small villages and plenty of churches. Visit the sacred Te A'itua temple and enjoy a refreshment. You'll continue to **Hooumi black sand beach** before returning to the pier.

Handicrafts are usually available for purchase at Te A'itua or at the beach; bring small denominations of cash, as credit cards are not accepted.

Notes:

Travel in the Marquesas involves secluded islands with limited facilities. Local transportation varies but is generally in private vehicles (double-cab-style SUVs) with no air-conditioning. Vehicles usually accommodate four guests (three in the back and one in the front). Seating cannot be reserved in advance. Families or friends may be split up. Vehicles are not guaranteed to be air-conditioned. This tour is mainly a sightseeing tour. Most of the drive is over a hard, flat road, although the short distance to the beach may be a little bumpy with some windy roads. Your driver may speak limited or no English; however, you will travel in 'caravan' style and there will be an Englishspeaking guide providing commentary at all the stops. Wear sunscreen, insect repellent and comfortable walking shoes. Bring water from the ship.

Walk on Coronado Island's sandy beach, take in the Old Town that brings the city's early Spanish days to life, have a wild time at the famous San Diego Zoo or a whale of a good time at Sea World.

For all tours other than the Signature Collection, it is exceptional for drivers of public hire vehicles to speak any language but their own and it is not always possible to obtain air-conditioned buses or taxis in many ports. However, we do our utmost to find the very best packages for your touring pleasure. Guests who leave during a tour for which transportation is included must thereafter provide for their

own transportation and services at their own expense. Transportation standards vary from country to country.

Self-Guided Touring

Guests who do not join these prearranged shore excursions must rely on whatever transportation is available in each port. If you choose to devise your own excursion, we suggest that you remind the driver or tour escort of the ship's sailing time. Of course, the ship's facilities are fully available to guests while in port.

Reservations & Online Reservations

Now you can easily choose your tour times, book your tours and receive confirmation of your shore exucursions reservations 24 hours a day. Make your payment online via our secure website, and receive confirmation as well as your tour departure times. You can also download the shore excursions, view tour prices, find answers to frequently asked questions and read general information. Remember, online and phone shore excursion reservations are processed prior to any requests made on board the ship and receive priority handling. At

the time of making your reservations online, we will advise you whether or not your reservations are confirmed or whether you have been waitlisted. Your credit card will be charged immediately for all confirmed reservations. Should space become available for a waitlisted tours request, we will e-mail or otherwise contact you at that time and either immediately charge your credit card if you have already given us your credit card information or ask you to provide us with that information for immediate charge processing. Reservations for shore excursions are subject to cancellation by us at any time prior to the credit card charge being accepted by your bank. If you or Holland America cancel a tour (except Overland Adventures and Overnights) more than 3 days prior to cruise departure, we will issue a credit on the credit card that you used to pay for the reservation. For any cancellation within 3 days of departure, a credit will not be given on your credit card. Instead, we will apply an ONBOARD CREDIT ONLY policy under which the refund (less any cancellation fee) will show up as a credit to the shipboard account of the person who was to take the tour. If the credit is not fully utilized during the cruise, the balance will be paid to that guest by the ship's Purser. Once on board, if you cancel your tour reservation after the booking deadline stated in the Shore Excursion Planning Form on board, a 100% cancellation fee will apply since transportation and services will have already been arranged. If space on the tour you have ordered is not available

you will be contacted to see if you are interested in another tour selection. You may receive confirmation of your tours via e-mail. Vouchers for each confirmed tour will be delivered to your stateroom after embarkation.

Immunizations

It is also a good idea to bring along a record of your immunizations, as requirements for immunizations may change. It is the guests' responsibility to remain apprised of changes in immunization policies, so that they have all the required inoculations and immunizations at the time of departure.

Safety

We take steps to identify and contract with reputable tour operators. Tour operators must comply with local government requirements and carry liability insurance in amounts consistent with local standards to address personal injury and property damage.

Visa Requirements

Each guest is responsible for obtaining all visas needed to join the cruise. Unless otherwise noted, it is the guest's sole responsibility to obtain any necessary visas to participate in any Overland Adventures and Overnights. Guests must keep themselves apprised of policy changes. Passports, visas (other than as specified above), tourist cards, and vaccinations, if required, are the sole responsibility of the guest. Remember, guests must have a passport that is valid for at least six months beyond the completion of their trip.
