You can do so with peace of mind as our website securely accepts credit card payments. After we process your payment, we will send your confirmation by email. If you prefer, you may call your Travel Agent to reserve your shore excursions.

About Your Excursions

Your cruise features one included excursion in each port of call; some are walking tours and others are via motor coach or a combination of walking and coach. Our excursion motor coaches are often just a few years old, are usually air conditioned and typically include restrooms. Drives rarely take more than two hours; nearly all have frequent sightseeing stops.

Please note, shore excursions are generally not offered on embarkation or disembarkation days. Optional shore excursions may be available on an overnight embark evening or with a pre-or post- cruise hotel extension program; please visit myvikingjourney.com to see what is available for your voyage. Shore excursions availability varies by departure date.

Sundays & Holidays

In many countries, shops, public buildings and banks are closed Sundays and public holidays; also, businesses in smaller towns may close for several hours midday. In these cases, a particular excursion or portion of visit may not be available, and your itinerary will vary. If you are exploring on your own on these days, your Program Director or Guest Services can suggest alternatives.

Optional Excursions

To further enhance your experience, we sometimes offer optional excursions should you want to visit an additional site or maximize your time in port. Details on these follow. Note that the order of visits may vary.



Activity Levels

Walking tours are often over uneven ground or cobblestones and may include stairs and inclines. We have graded all our tours by activity level below, but feel free to ask your Program Director should you have any questions.

Easy

Walking portions are generally over easy surfaces, but may be uneven in parts and contain some step-ups and slight inclines. Total time walking or standing is normally not longer than 1.5 hours. Guests may need to board and disembark transport, including coaches, trains and boats.

Moderate


Walking portions may be long and somewhat challenging with occasional step-ups, stairs, inclines and uneven ground. Total time walking or standing normally ranges from 1.5 to 3 hours. Guests may need to board and disembark transport, including coaches, trains and boats.

Demanding

Physically challenging activities, including extensive walking, hiking, riding, water sports and excursions at high altitudes. Activities by foot may contain difficult and unpaved surfaces and/or multiple stairs and steep inclines. Total time walking or standing may exceed 3 hours. Guests may need to board and disembark transport, including coaches, trains and boats.

Wheelchair (available on Ocean cruises only)






Tracing the Routes of Madeira's Agricultural History -- Follow Madeira's complex irrigation system by foot, tracing hillsides and connecting with a rich agricultural past. Known as the "Garden Island" for its rich agriculture, terraced hills and beautiful flowers, Madeira is an enchanting Atlantic paradise and a horticulturalist's dream. The island's ubiquitous irrigation aqueducts, or levadas, were dug into the steep hillsides in the 1800s so that early farmers could make use of every patch of land and channel mountain waters to their fields. Today, footpaths follow some of the 1,350 miles of aqueducts, giving you a fascinating way to explore. With your guide, you will drive to Vale do Paraíso, where your walk begins gently for about a half hour on level trails to Camacha. After refreshments here, continue to Rochão, a magnificent stroll along a century-old levada that passes cultivated terraces, stunning gardens and breathtaking vistas. This excursion requires strenuous walking for two hours, covering 31/2 miles.

On a clear day, you will enjoy magnificent panoramas from your ski-lift style gondola and admire the twin towers of Monte's 18th-century church as you approach the top. If you would like, you can descend to Livramento via Funchal's famous toboggans, wicker basket sleds piloted by two drivers with rubber soles for braking. Enjoy an exhilarating ride down through the winding neighborhood streets, your skilled drivers rounding the sharp corners with ease. Continue to the Pico dos Barcelos overlook for fantastic views. En route back to your ship, stop at Blandy's Wine Lodge to sample the island's famous namesake wine.



Continue into the steep mountains and valleys then traverse the fragrant pine and eucalyptus forest to Cabo Girão, the world's second highest sea cliff and the highest in Europe. It emerges sheer from the sea and provides breathtaking panoramas. Step onto its glass platform overhanding the cliff top if you dare, and browse the gift shop for handicrafts. En route back to your ship, stop in historic Funchal and enjoy free time to explore what is thought to be one of Europe's most hidden gems.

Here, you will learn about the island's long-standing wine-making tradition and sample three different types of its famous Madeira wine. A unique aging process, in which the wine is exposed to high temperatures for long periods of time, gives Madeira its distinctive taste; it was a favorite of colonial Americans and even used to toast the signing of the Declaration of Independence in 1776. You will also visit the Fábrica de Santo António. Founded in 1893, this factory produces typical Madeiran sweets such as biscuits, cookies, fennel candies, jams and honey cane syrup cake. Tour the production facilities and sample some of their creations. At the end of your excursion, you will return to your awaiting ship.
