Which Shore Excursions Are Right for You?

Choose the tours that interest you by using the icons as a general guide to the level of activity involved, and select the tours best suited to your physical capabilities. These icons will help you to interpret this brochure.



Easy Activity: Very light activity including short distances to walk; may include some steps.



Moderate Activity: Requires intermittent effort throughout, including walking medium distances over uneven surfaces and/or steps.



Strenuous Activity: Requires active participation, walking long distances over uneven and steep terrain or on steps. In certain instances, paddling or other non-walking activity is required and guests must be able to participate without discomfort or difficulty breathing.



Panoramic Tours: Specially designed for guests who enjoy a slower pace, these tours offer sightseeing mainly from the transportation vehicle, with few or no stops, and no mandatory disembarkation from the vehicle during the tour. As vehicles outside the United States are rarely lift-equipped and ramps are seldom available, a very small amount of walking will be necessary. The pace is gentle and taking your time is encouraged.



Limited Capacity: The number of people able to participate in this tour is strictly limited. Reasons for limiting capacity may include the number of transportation seats available, or the need to maintain a safe ratio of guides for hikes, fishing and water activities. Tours require a minimum number of participants in order to operate.




Snack: This tour includes a small snack or tasting of local specialties. The snack is not a meal.

Guests Using A Mobility Aid Device or Wheelchair

I have a disability. How do I know which tours will best suit me?

The tours are graded according to the relative level of activity they entail. The activity icons that appear at the beginning of each tour description provide a general idea of the level of activity to expect. Please see page 1 for specific information or speak to a Shore Excursions specialist (1.888.425.9376). It is important to keep in mind that tour operators are subject to the laws of their own country with respect to accommodating the needs of guests with disabilities. In most foreign countries, the laws are not as stringent as those in the United States.

Will I encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship when it's in port?

Please see the on-board Shore Excursions staff to help determine whether you can expect to encounter difficulties (dis)embarking the ship in a particular port of call. The decision whether or not to carry or provide other mobility assistance to a guest and their device (wheelchair, walker, etc.) up or down a ship's gangway, or on or off a tender boat, is at the sole discretion of the Captain, made based on his evaluation of guest and crew safety. We encourage you to bring a collapsible wheelchair as space limitations may restrict the ability of some tour operators to accommodate motorized mobility aid devices.

Frequently Asked Questions

What should I wear?

Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for all shore excursions. When you visit places of worship, we recommend dressing conservatively (no shorts or sleeveless tops), but casual clothing is perfectly acceptable. Dress in layers and have a jacket along. Bring an umbrella or raincoat, a hat and sunscreen.

What about meals?

Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. In-room dining is available on board.

How will I know what time each tour departs?

The on-board Shore Excursions Order Form in your stateroom will show departure times. This information will also be printed on your shore excursions tickets, which you will receive on board. Approximate tour departure times are posted on our website at hollandamerica.com.

I am traveling with friends. Can we be accommodated on the same motorcoach?

The departure location for each tour is printed on

your shore excursions tickets. If you wish to travel with friends, please arrive at the designated meeting place together. This will enable the staff to allocate space for you on the same vehicle.



The cost includes the service of a English-speaking guide and/or driver, unlimited mileage, road tolls, parking fees and bottled water.

Not Included (Unless Otherwise Noted)

Guests' entrance fees for attractions are not included in the price due to the wide range of attraction possibilities, uncertain number of attractions to be visited, and varying number of guests participating. We strongly recommend that you bring some local currency to cover such costs as credit cards are not readily accepted in some ports. Lunch will not be included on any tour as many guests prefer to select their own dining venue.

Bridgetown, Barbados - Thursday, January 8, 2026: Some say this island is more British than Britain. Here cricket is the national sport, afternoon tea goes without saying and motorists hug left. The friendly island spirit, local rum and fried flying fish are strictly Bajan!

4x4 Safari Adventure



Departs: 9:00 AM
Approximately 3 Hours
Adult \$109.95; Child \$99.95

Hop into a **4x4 vehicle** and depart the pier in convoy, heading first to the parish of **St George**. Here, you will view the renowned Gun Hill Signal Station. As you pass this historical site, look for the statue of a lion carved from a single piece of stone by Captain Henry Wilkinson in 1868.

Proceed to St Joseph and venture into **Joe’s River Forest**. Winding along its tree-lined paths, you’ll admire rows of *ficus* , white woods, cabbage palms, mahogany and bearded fig trees. This tropical rainforest is home to a host of wildlife and covers 85 acres of hills, gullies and plains.

At **Bathsheba**, you will stop briefly to take in the striking vistas, rugged hillsides and pounding surf.

Then, reboard your vehicle for a drive to **Cattlewash Hill**, where you will enjoy a refreshing **beverage** as you look out over Barbados’ lovely countryside. From here, journey through Barclay’s Park -- a 50-acre reserve on the island’s east coast. Opened by Queen Elizabeth II in 1966, this park commemorates the island’s independence and was a gift from Barclays Bank to the Government of Barbados. Travel past the calm waters of Long Pond and along the trail

of Morgan Lewis Hill.

On your way to the beach stop, you will travel through historic Holetown, where the first European settlers landed. Before you return to the pier, take a quick dip in the crystal-clear waters at **Brandon’s Beach**.

Notes:

The vehicle seating is configured with guests facing each other on long benches-type seats. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Ride will be bumpy; guests who are pregnant and those with a back or neck condition are not allowed to participate. Minimum age is 5 years. Maximum weight is 250 lbs. Wear your swimsuit under your clothing; bring a towel, reef-safe/biodegradable sunscreen, light clothing to act as a full cover-up for further protection from the sun, and a hat. Swim at your own risk.

Atlantis Odyssey Submarine



Departs: 11:45 AM
Approximately 2½ Hours
Adult \$139.95; Child \$99.95

Experience the award-winning **Atlantis submarine** ride -- one of Barbados' highly-recommended attractions for adults and children alike.

Transfer to the sub on board the *Ocean Quest* **ferry** as the professional crew welcomes you and provides an informative

safety briefing. The white sandy beaches of the Barbados coastline are always in view as you cruise out to the dive site. Make the easy transition from the Ocean Quest to the submarine, the *Atlantis XV* .

Discover what it feels like to be on a real **submarine**, fully submerged in the azure waters with large portholes surrounding you. Peering out the window, you will likely come face-to-face with curious exotic fish, who peek in at you as sea fans sway in the background.

You'll see an old shipwreck and reach depths of 150 feet. The knowledgeable co-pilot narrates the 40-minute underwater adventure and will help you to identify the fantastic sights outside your window.

Re-surfacing, you will transfer back to the *Ocean Quest* and head back to shore.

Notes:

Minimum age is 4 years. Minimum height is 3 feet. Participants must be able to access the sub via a ladder with 11 steps.

Barbados Beach Break

Transfer from Bridgetown's port to **Harbour Lights Beach**.

Listen to a briefing on the facility's various amenities as you enjoy a refreshing welcome **beverage**. Select your beach chair and either relax on the beach or swim in the aqua-colored ocean.

Harbour Lights boasts a spectacular beach. The facilities include a full-service bar and a barbecue grill serving traditional fare with hamburgers, fries, hot dogs and sandwiches available for purchase (at your own expense).

Notes:

Beach chair, shared umbrella, and showers are included. Wear your swimsuit under your clothing; bring a towel, reef-safe/biodegradable sunscreen, light clothing to act as a full cover-up for further protection from the sun, and a hat. Swim at your own risk.

Barbados Coast to Coast

Enjoy an excellent introduction to Barbados on this **scenic drive** with minimal walking involved. Sit back and relax in style as you soak up the highlights of this gorgeous island. You'll call into one of Barbados' oldest churches, St John's, which sits on a cliff 800 feet above sea level, offering magnificent coastal views.

With its beautifully landscaped plantings, Tropical Garden is well worth the visit. Relax on the deck as you sip on a cool Bajan rum punch or fruit punch and absorb the peaceful atmosphere of the park as you watch hummingbirds at play or a troop of monkeys in the distance.

You'll also pass a host of sights, including Heroes Square (formerly Trafalgar Square), Gun Hill Signal Station, opulent Sandy Lane, and Holetown where you will see the monument commemorating the first European settlers' landing in 1627.

Barbados In Focus: A Photographic Expedition

You don't have to be an expert to join this **photography expedition** -- it is for both experienced photographers and novices with an interest in capturing magical shots.

This truly Barbadian experience takes you through some of the island's most picturesque areas. It is informative and presents **photo opportunities** while promoting fun and a team spirit among the participants. The outing is coordinated by photographer/filmmaker Ronnie Carrington, known for his stunning, thought-provoking black and white images and his work chronicling the folk life and landscape of Barbados over the last quarter-century.

The scene for your day was set back when sugar was king here in Barbados. You will follow the plantation/village culture, highlighting the unique dwellings and places of worship, recreation and natural beauty associated with a bygone era. Ronnie will provide you with photographic pointers and acquaint you with the nuances of photographic lighting conditions in a tropical environment. He also relates fascinating folktales and interesting anecdotes.

Your route offers a wealth of photographic opportunities, from the Scotland District in the hilly interior to the foaming surf of the Atlantic. The tour winds its way across the island to the magnificent east coast, where the

Atlantic breakers end their journey on these lovely shores. Giant sea stacks rise from the ocean floor to create the silent sentinels that give the Bathsheba area its unique character.

Notes:

Bring your camera, memory card and extra battery. You are also welcomed to use your cell phone camera. Tour does not operate on holidays.

Alternatively, you may choose to simply relax and absorb the peaceful atmosphere of the park as you watch hummingbirds at play or a troop of monkeys in the distance.

At the **Sunbury House**, a 300-year-old plantation estate built by one of the island's first settlers, you will discover the Caribbean's most extensive collection of antique horse-drawn carriages, among other optical machinery and agricultural relics. This is also where you'll learn how to mix up the traditional Bajan rum punch and other tantalizing cocktails

Easy Harrison's Cave Experience

This **accessible Barbados shore excursion** invites you to uncover the magic of Harrison's Cave.

Meet your driver and accessible van at the Barbados cruise pier. Head out on a scenic **panoramic drive** to **Harrison's Cave**. Here, the visitor center features a special elevator down to the ground level of the cave entrance.

As you wait to board the tram, visit the small **handicraft shops** and **botanic garden area**. An exhibit of indigenous artifacts excavated from various sites around the island is also quite interesting.

The **accessible tram** takes you on a 45-minute journey beneath the earth's surface to uncover the magic of Harrison's Cave. The lively commentary adds to your enjoyment of the cavern and its beautiful calcite and limestone formations.

The tram stops often, so you can take beautiful photos inside the cave.

Notes:

Minimum height is 5 feet. This tour is designed to be accessible for all guests, including those using a wheelchair (the tour operator suggests you bring a companion to assist, as guides are not allowed to push wheelchairs). The tour route avoids stairs; however, the nature of access may differ from the standards you are familiar with at home. Accessible bathrooms with wide doors are available along the tour route. Begin your journey in the heart of Bridgetown at the bustling vendor market. Stroll through vibrant stalls overflowing with fresh local produce, spices, and unique Barbadian ingredients. As you explore, learn about the island's rich culinary history, from its African, European, and Indian influences on the cherished traditions that shape Barbadian cuisine today. Discover the stories behind

iconic dishes and their role in the island’s heritage.


Next, head to a cozy, local food spot for a hands-on cooking class where you'll roll up your sleeves and “Eat Like a Bajan.” Under the guidance of a warm and knowledgeable host, you’ll learn to prepare classic Barbadian delights such as crispy fish cakes, fluffy bakes, and sweet, moist banana bread. This interactive session will teach you not only the techniques but also the heart and soul behind these beloved dishes.

As you savor the fruits of your labor, enjoy the camaraderie of sharing a meal prepared with your own hands. Leave with new skills, recipes, and a deeper appreciation for the flavors and traditions that make Barbados a true culinary gem.

Five-Star Catamaran & Turtle Encounter

Relax on the deck of a fabulous **catamaran** as sunlight sparkles on the surface of the azure waters of the Caribbean Sea. On this five-hour cruise, smiling faces offer cool, refreshing drinks as you glide past the beautiful palm-fringed beaches of Barbados. After a pleasant sail along the coast, you’ll anchor in a quiet bay.

Swim, snorkel over a reef, walk on the beach, or relax on the deck. **A delicious buffet** is served, including rice and peas, Bajan macaroni pie, baked chicken, grilled fish, salads and cake.

Enjoy around 90 minutes of relaxation before sailing to a different area to **snorkel and swim with turtles** .

At the award-winning **Foursquare Distillery**, learn about the 350-year-old Barbadian tradition of rum making, including the process of aging, blending, and bottling. **Sample the award-winning rums** produced here at the self-proclaimed most modern rum distillery in the Western Hemisphere. Tour the Heritage Park, purchase a bottle of rum if you wish, and browse among a wide range of great souvenirs.

A **scenic panoramic drive** through the countryside returns you to the pier.

Speightstown is the second-largest town in Barbados and was once known as Little Bristol. It was eventually named after William Speight -- the Member of Parliament on whose land it was built.

Your friendly, knowledgeable guide imparts stories about the island's history, culture and natural wonders. (S)he will point out the famous giant baobab tree brought from Africa in 1738.

Journey through the countryside to **Farley Hill**. Situated 850 feet above sea level, this spot offers an excellent view of the verdant highlands of the Scotland District and the parish of St Andrew, named after Scotland's Patron Saint.

Continue through lush hillside greenery and softly swaying sugarcane plantations en route to the small town of Belleplane. The **East Coast Road** abuts the rugged terrain and hillsides of the Scotland District on one side and the crashing waves of the Atlantic Ocean on the other.

You're headed to the sleepy seaside village of **Bathsheba**, famous for its year-round surfing.

The waves, wind, and time have conspired to sculpt giant mushroom-shaped rock formations that jut majestically out of the pounding surf. The largest of these is called Bathsheba Rock. Take photos of these stunning formations from the seaside.

A stone's throw away is the **Andromeda Botanic Gardens** in the parish of St Joseph. Nestled on a cliff overlooking the coast, this lavish six-acre garden features more than 600 species of exotic plants as well as a grotto-like lily pond and one of the world's largest palm trees. Sip a refreshing beverage and listen to an overview of the gardens and their history. Explore the tranquil meandering paths bordered by orchids, ferns, hibiscus and even the famed bearded fig trees, from which the island's name derives. Los Barbados means 'the bearded ones.' Meandering along the East Coast Road, take

in the views of the rugged Atlantic coast and pause for photos at **Morgan Lewis Windmill** - the last functioning windmill on the island.

Art & Culture of Belem

To get a feel for everyday life in Belem, visit the main cultural monuments of the city, including the **Da Paz Theatre** -- considered one of the prettiest in Brazil. It is built in neo-Classical style and opened in 1878. You will also see the Museum of Sacred Arts, formed by the architectural ensemble of the Church of Saint Alexander and the Episcopal Palace. It shelters fantastic works of religious art.

The **Fortress Museum** holds ceramic pieces

that show the arrival of the European colonizers in the region during the 17th century.

The São José Liberto **former jail** is now a **handicrafts market**, and the **Jeweler Polo Gems Museum** displays more than 4,000 pieces, including diamonds, quartz, crystals and amethysts.

Depart from the pier to visit the largest open-air market in Brazil -- the **Ver-O-Peso Market** . Take a guided walk through this huge outdoor market that sprawls four blocks and is the city’s most beloved landmark. It is filled with stalls offering typical food, pottery handicrafts, handmade clothing, and charms made by the practitioners of *macumba*

(Brazil’s version of voodoo). There’s a fresh vegetable and tropical fruit section, and a fish market with freshwater fish brought in every morning.

Forte do Castelo fortress was built by the Portuguese during the 17th century. It stands on the highest point of the city to protect new colony against Dutch and French occupation.

Head to **Emilio Goeldi Zoo & Botanical Park** -- 12 acres of wooded area and one of the most important research centers in Brazil. The Park is dedicated to studying Amazon fauna and flora and boasts more than 1,500 samples of plant species and more than 1,600 types of fruit trees that grow in the region. Seven hundred types of timber grow here, and it is populated by some animal species from the Amazon.

Before the return drive to the pier, you will stop at the **Basilica of Our Lady of Nazareth** -- built during the rubber boom era at the beginning of the 20th century. It is a copy of the St Paul’s church in Rome, renowned for its architecture, central nave, stained-glass windows and beautiful altar.

Easy Belem

Founded by the Portuguese as a fortress city to defend the Amazon estuary against the Dutch, Belem flourished with the 18th-century spice trade and the 19th-century rubber boom. Today, the colonial and republican architecture, the leafy squares, and a fascinating history make Belem an interesting place to discover.

Pass the Ver-O-Peso Market located on the waterfront. This market brings together hundreds of vendors and is popular with locals and visitors alike.

Watch for the Cathedral da Se, the Forte Do Presepio, and for gorgeous Emilio Goeldi Park, dedicated to the study of Amazonian fauna and flora.

See the Basilica of Nazareth, built during the rubber boom; it’s an elaborate copy of St Paul’s Basilica in Rome.

Finally, spot the magnificent **Da Paz Theatre** - a work of architectural grace as beautiful as any aria ever sung upon its stage.

Recife, Brazil - Thursday, January 15, 2026: Although the city takes its name from the colorful reefs that rim its beaches, Recife's most famous geographical feature is surely the series of canals and rivers that crisscross the city - making it the "Venice of Brazil." Nearby: colonial Olinda, a UNESCO World Heritage Site restored to its 1581 glory.

Cultural Olinda & Recife

Visit **Olinda**, the colonial regional capital of Pernambuco, with its grand houses and quaint churches.

Step inside at the **São Salvador Gallery** and see the Alto da Sé, the Sé Cathedral and Misericórdia Church. From the latter, take a moment to admire the most beautiful view of Olinda and Recife. The **Old Town** of Olinda is a **UNESCO World Heritage Site**.

Returning to Recife, you will see **Marco Zero** - a monument on the spot where Recife was founded by the Portuguese in 1537.

Walk down Bom Jesus Street, which once was the epicenter of the Jewish population in Recife. The synagogue and Jewish cultural center are still located here.

Visit **Pernambuco Embassy** -- an exhibition center featuring the famous **giant carnival dolls** from Olinda. The first giant dolls, representing famous people such as singers, football players, actors, etc, were made of papier maché. Today, they are made of fiberglass, which is much lighter. This is a great opportunity to see a little of Olinda's carnival spirit, and it's easy to imagine the parade itself with these enormous puppets.

Recife & Historic Olinda

A charming feature of this must-see tour is that it crosses many of Recife's **graceful bridges** and passes along Boa Viagem Beach - a favorite with the locals.

From Republic Square, take photos of the Justice Hall, St Isabel Theatre and the Governor's Mansion, which houses the city's administrative offices.

You'll visit **Casa da Cultura** -- a former prison turned **handicraft market**. The old cells are now individual stores. Take advantage of 30 minutes here to shop and immerse yourself in the history and culture of Recife.

Drive by motorcoach four miles north to the colonial city of **Olinda**, founded by the Portuguese in 1537 and now a National Monument of Brazil. In 1982, Olinda became a **UNESCO World Heritage site**, leading to a full restoration of this once-proud city. Zoning rules now restrict redevelopment and preserve the remaining pastel-colored stucco buildings, colonial lattice and heavy,

intricately carved doors. Many of the quaint houses are adorned with delicate balconies overlooking the narrow streets.

You'll see the Church of Our Lady of Mercy -- a magnificent sample of Baroque art -- and step inside the **Sé Cathedral** for a postcard-perfect view of Olinda and Recife.

Admire from the outside the Convento São Francisco -- the first Franciscan Convent in Brazil. Hidden among coconut trees, it was rebuilt between 1715 and 1754 and is still home to many monks.

You will visit the **Monastery of St Benedict** -- an important Catholic architectural complex also built in Baroque style. A highlight of your guided tour is the **Golden Chapel**. Built between 1696 and 1724, this Baroque chapel is one of Brazil's most beautiful examples of religious architecture.

You will taste *asado* (barbecue) accompanied by delicious salads. As you enjoy your lunch, your guide will explain the production of *dulce de leche* -- a famous Uruguayan

dessert. You'll savor a taste of this specialty afterward.

Drive back to the pier via the La Barra de Maldonado and San Rafael districts.

Visit the **Recoleta Cemetery** -- an outstanding display of 19th- and 20th-century funerary art and architecture, with private family crypts of the bourgeoisie and mausolea of the landed

gentry. Presidents of Argentina, Nobel Prize winners, the founder of the Argentine Navy, and the granddaughter of Napoleon are buried here. Perhaps the most famous **tomb** is that of **Eva Perón**.

Continue by motorcoach to a literary gem of the city -- **El Ateneo**. This iconic building opened in 1919 as the Grand Splendid Theatre and screened the first sound films presented in Argentina. Nowadays, it's a flagship **bookstore**, and more than a million books now fill its private boxes, wings and stalls. Beautiful frescos cover the ceiling, and the former theatre stage hosts an excellent café. Enjoy a **coffee and a light snack** while taking in the grandeur of this cathedral of literature.

After some **free time** to browse and purchase a souvenir, head back to the ship by motorcoach, taking in many more panoramic city highlights.

You can stroll around the farm, take a horse and carriage ride, or watch the gauchos preparing your **barbecue lunch** (consisting of renowned Argentine beef steaks), salads and desserts. Red wine, beer, mineral water, soft drinks and coffee are available. A delightful folkloric show, including dancing and singing, represents life on the pampas.

Hear the thunder of hooves as the gauchos demonstrate their skills in the saddle with spectacular races and precision throwing of the boleador.

You will stroll down Arroyo Street, with its famous art galleries and shops. Arriving at **Plaza San Martin**, admire the impressive

statue of Argentina's national hero and liberator, General San Martin. German sculptor Gustaf Eberlein designed the statue. The square, originally used as a bullring, is surrounded by architectural gems such as the Kavanagh Building and the Plaza Hotel, built in 1909 by the German architect Alfred Zucker (also famous for St Patrick's Cathedral in New York City). Return by coach to the pier. Guests wishing to stay in town to shop or explore the pedestrian/shopping zone of Florida Street independently are welcome to do so but must make their own way back to the ship.

Get to know one of the most colorful neighborhoods of Buenos Aires, La Boca, and visit its immense stadium, known as La Bombonera (the chocolate box), for its unique shape. Its vertiginous tiers offer fantastic views for the followers who cheer on their heroes with fervor, week in, week out. **La Bombonera stadium** is the birthplace of soccer in Argentina, which came to South America with the European immigrants of the 19th century.

Inside the stadium, you can see the field, the **Club Museum** and the trophy room. The latter succinctly summarizes the history of the

city and the long history of the Club. The museum's long lobby features images of all the first-division players who have defended their jersey colors since 1931, including the famous Diego Maradona. In a room shaped like a giant soccer ball, you'll experience this sport in 360 degrees. Then, head down onto the pitch of La Bombonera to enjoy a stupendous visual spectacle.

Leaving soccer behind, you will continue through the La Boca neighborhood to the **Caminito**, where you can stroll through the **open-air market** and observe the locals practicing their tango skills. You will also have the opportunity to buy **souvenirs** from local vendors.

A drive past the city’s picturesque beaches makes for a perfect end to your Montevideo adventure.

This authentic working ranch is the home to 650 milking cows producing 12,000 liters of milk daily, assisted by state-of-the-art technology and productivity systems. You will be amazed at the perfect blend of rustic simplicity and cultural refinement that is characteristic of La Rábida, along with an **authentic glimpse of Uruguayan life**.

Marvel at the scenery surrounding the ranch, with fields stretching onto high cliffs overlooking the striking beach coast of Rio de la Plata. Indulge in a traditional *asado* (barbecue) lunch with wine and soft drinks. As you relax at the ranch, take note of the unusual birdlife.

You will also learn about some of the daily chores that are part of **gaucho life**, such as milking, mustering, and household tasks.

German Guided: Graf Spee, On the Trail of a Legend

Graf Spee was a German battleship with state-of-the-art (at the time) technology. She suffered significant damage during World War II and made her way to Montevideo for repairs. Spies from the United Kingdom and New Zealand approached the captain of the Graf Spee and led him to believe that a flotilla was waiting to attack as soon as *Graf Spee* left Uruguay. In fact, only the HMS *Cumberland* was prepared to go into battle with the Graf Spee. *Graf Spee*’s captain decided to sink her in the harbor and then killed himself.

Today’s **panoramic drive** through the city shows you the streets and buildings that captured the world’s attention in 1939 and 1940 when the Uruguayan, British and German governments negotiated the fate of *Graf Spee* and her crew. Check out the buildings that once housed the British and German embassies, the port authority and the military hospital. Along the way, take time to

admire the combination of different architectural styles as well as some of Montevideo’s oldest squares and monuments.

Enjoy panoramic views of the bay from **Cerro de Montevideo** and imagine the fateful day when curious citizens crowded the harbor to witness the arrival of a German warship.

You also visit the northern cemetery, where 40 fallen German sailors were buried. At the British Cemetery, two graves serve as a dark reminder of the Battle of Rio de la Plata.

Your final stop is at the **Marine Museum**, which houses some of *Graf Spee*’s guns and telemetry equipment recently recovered from the riverbed.

Drive along the coast back to the harbor and enjoy the beautiful views of the city’s beaches.

Montevideo reflects its European heritage in its architecture and attitude. During a relaxing **panoramic drive**, your guide will bring to life many of the city highlights. Enjoy views of the Solis Theatre and Government House and a photo stop at Independence Square.

Take in a great **view of Montevideo Bay from Virgilio Square**.

At **Varela Zarranz Winery**, one of the oldest and most beautiful wine establishments in Uruguay, a path lined with centenary olive trees leads you through the vineyards to the winery. Founded at the end of the 19th century, today, it is a landmark heritage building of Uruguayan viticulture.

A family member will guide you on a tour, explaining the history of the establishment and the process of winemaking, including the traditional *méthode Champenoise*, under which the family elaborates natural sparkling wines. You will also visit the barrel room and the old cellar to view the treasured largest collection of French oak barrels in use in Uruguay, with some dating from 1903. Check out the collection of vintage carriages kept on site.

Then, relax and enjoy a **typical Uruguayan barbecue paired with different wine labels**, including the family’s natural sparkling wine.

74 Days to Victory

This **panoramic driving tour** takes in Fitzroy and three battle memorials depicting the fierce hand-to-hand battles between Argentine and British soldiers in the bitter 74-day Falklands War of 1982. In conditions reminiscent of World War I, British soldiers fought to end the Argentine occupation of the islands. Sapper Hill, Mt William, Mt Tumbledown, Mt Harriet and the Two Sisters battlefields will be viewed and discussed. You will also see Mt Longdon and Wireless Ridge.

Your main destination is Fitzroy and Port Pleasant (one hour from Stanley), where the British logistics landing ships *Sir Galahad* and *Sir Tristram* were bombed by Argentine Skyhawk aircraft while transferring troops, ammunition and equipment. See memorials for the Welsh Guards and Royal Fleet Auxiliary. The settlement of Fitzroy is primarily a sheep farm but is diversifying, and you will stop briefly here to see the progress.

Bertha's Beach & Flatlands Wildlife

Travel to **Bertha's Beach** -- a scenic sandy beach nestled along the beautiful coastline of the Falkland Islands, where ocean and wetland wildlife live and thrive in harmony. This Ramsar Site is named for the barque *Bertha* , shipwrecked here in 1952.

The island's main road network winds through a rugged Falklands landscape, punctuated by the unique geological stone runs that were cataloged by Charles Darwin. After approximately an hour, your vehicle turns off-road for a 30-minute adventure across the flatlands. This terrain is home to some elusive waterfowl, such as the graceful black-neck swan, Chiloe wigeon, silver teal, speckled teal and silvery grebe.

Bertha's Beach itself boasts a **Gentoo penguin colony** with more than 800 birds. Additionally, more than 80 different flowering plants have been recorded here, five of which are endemic to the Falkland Islands. Among the many are the dog orchid, the yellow violet, Falkland lavender and the National Flower -- the pale maiden.

You will have approximately one hour at the beach to enjoy the wildlife and scenery before returning to Stanley.

Notes:

Child seats are mandatory; guests without child seats should request one from Shore Excursions at least 72 hours in advance, and the cost of the child seat will be charged directly to the guests. Bluff Cove Penguin Rookery

King and Gentoo penguins and other birds of the Falklands are the stars of this award-winning scenic excursion to Bluff Cove Lagoon -- a privately owned wildlife haven.

Meet the Bluff Cove team on the pier and head out by **minibus** for a 30-minute journey through Stanley and across the rolling hills to **Bluff Cove Lagoon**.

Upon your arrival at the **Bluff Cove Lagoon penguin rookery**, knowledgeable and friendly rangers will brief you about what to expect and what to look for. **Stroll** through the

penguin colony, which features a scenic backdrop of a large lagoon and a white, sandy beach that is occasionally patrolled by sea lions from the nearby island. This pristine reserve is home to more than 1,000 breeding pairs of Gentoo penguins, which protect the growing colony of king penguins and their chicks. Magellan penguins, which burrow on the nearby island, can also be found on the beach. Bird species that frequent or nest in the area include skuas, upland geese, ruddy-headed geese, Magellan oystercatchers, South American terns, dolphin gulls, flightless Falkland steamer ducks, snowy sheathbills and southern giant petrels.

Warm up with a **cup of tea, coffee or hot chocolate** served at the legendary **Sea Cabbage Café** on the beach and enjoy delicious **home-baked treats**, including scones with diddle-dee jam and fresh cream (gluten-free options available). Bask in the warmth and aroma of the peat stove while enjoying splendid vistas of waves crashing on the sandy beach, and perhaps see some penguins porpoising in.

The **Bluff Cove Museum**, also by the beach, depicts life in the Falklands and tells the story of *Penguins & Pioneers* . Learn about the farm, the nearby 1863 ‘sugar wreck,’ the 1982 war with Argentina, and the fabulous lagoon wildlife.

You will have approximately two hours of **free time** to take photographs, stroll along the beach, and look around the museum. A small gift shop sells unique Bluff Cove souvenirs,

including Bluff Cove Tweed items made with farm wool and postcards that can be stamped and mailed from here. Look for samples of knitted, crocheted and felted wool work displayed on the walls of the café and museum.

Return to **Stanley** and visit the new **Stanley Museum** at the historic dockyard.

Falkland Battlefields

Explore **the battlefields of the 1982 Falklands Conflict** with an expert guide. You will visit the epicenter of some of the main battles fought here.

Designed for the history and military buff, this excursion offers a firsthand look at the

many battlefields left behind by the Falklands War. The islands were invaded and occupied by Argentina in April 1982; in response, Britain launched a naval taskforce to retake the islands. The war lasted just 74 days, but more than 900 military and civilian lives were lost. Today, a local battlefield expert leads you on a tour of one of the major battle sites.

A **panoramic drive** brings you to **Estancia Farm**. As you travel, it may be hard to imagine that some of the fiercest fighting took place around the low-lying, green hills all around you. There is no cover here -- no trees to hide behind or mountainous caves to use as a bolthole. Scattered throughout the islands are many reminders of the war -- manmade bunkers, foxholes, discarded clothing and used munitions dot the windswept coasts and mountains. Minefields still cover much of the open countryside and are clearly marked. Estancia Farm became a base for hundreds of British troops. The coach will stop here, and you can step off to enjoy the views westward while your guide explains the famous 'yomp' from San Carlos and the Battle for Goose Green.

Heading east, back towards Stanley, your guide explains how British forces positioned themselves around the surrounding mountains. You will stop to view the wreckage of the Chinook and Puma, and to take in the view of Stanley and the five surrounding mountains, each of which was a battle site. Your guide provides details about the final battles that took place in the run-up to the Liberation of Stanley on June 14th, 1982.

Your expert local guide will distribute a tour-specific illustrated checklist and give a general background to Falkland birds and what you might expect to see on this tour: dark-faced ground tyrants, Falkland thrush, upland geese, long-tailed meadowlark, Falkland flightless steamer duck, rock cormorants, southern giant petrels, sooty shearwaters, Magellan penguins, black-throated finch and up to as many as 30 other species.

There are also spectacular **views of Stanley** from this picturesque bay.

On the drive from Stanley to Fitzroy, your driver guide will tell you about the history of the Falklands, how sheep farming started here, and island life in the present day.

At your destination, **Fitzroy Farm**, you’ll head straight to the **shearing shed**. Walk a few steps to the sheep pens and watch as a disciplined and focused sheepdog brings the flock in. Listen to an explanation of the layout of the shed and how the wool is assessed and pressed. A couple of sheep will lose their fleece right in front of you.

Step outside and walk 150 yards to the **Settlement Hall** for *smoko* . This local patois

means **morning snack and coffee**, of course. Whatever you call it, the homemade cakes and treats, including scones with cream and jam, and savory pastries, are all homemade by a winner of the Falkland Islands Tourist Board Taste of the Falklands Award.

Farm Manager Gilberto, his partner Suzi, and other Fitzroy residents are on hand to answer your questions about life and farming in the Falkland Islands.

Don't miss the chance to buy **locally crafted souvenirs**, and the Settlement Hall has some displays showcasing the history of the Battle for the Falklands in 1982 and the role Fitzroy and the surrounding area played in its outcome.

A 300-yard walk or drive brings you to the polytunnels and **vegetable gardens**, where veges grow year-round. Pet sheep and miniature horses roam freely here, and your hosts will talk about holistically managed grazing, water and energy sources for the farm.

Cross the field on foot or take the transportation to the **farm manager's house** to see the flower garden and a display of equestrian gear.

On the drive back to Stanley, you will see the unique local geology in the form of stone runs and one of the key battlefields from 1982.

At the Gentoo penguin rookery, you will enjoy approximately one hour with the penguins, observing them going about their business with little regard for your presence.

Other birds to watch for are southern giant petrels, skuas, rock cormorants, upland geese, turkey vultures, kelp gulls and, occasionally, flightless steamer ducks in their natural environment. From Beach Point, you'll have an excellent view of Wickham Heights and the stunning island coastline packed with exciting bird life.

elephant seal colony. Observe these peculiar-looking marine mammals as they bask happily in the cold and blustery environment that they love. This is a truly unusual opportunity to observe them at relatively close range in their undisturbed habitat.

Depart from Ushuaia's pier by **catamaran** for a scenic cruise past Lapataia Bay toward the southeast. You're headed along the **Beagle Channel**, passing its numerous islands, landscapes, birds and marine mammals. On a clear day, the backdrop is the snow-capped mountains to the north and Albert Agostini National Park to the southwest, with a glimpse of Puerto Williams to the south.

Along the way, you will see Isla de los Pajaros, inhabited by a colony of Imperial cormorants, and Isla de los Lobos, where two species of sea lion lollygag about on windswept rocks.

You will pass through the **Les Eclaireurs archipelago** and see the **lighthouse** bearing the same name.

Further east, at Hammer Island, you'll spend 30 minutes just offshore observing (from the boat) a very large, healthy colony of clumsy, playful **Magellan penguins** smartly dressed in their gray-and-white plumage.

A **snack** is included on the catamaran.

Notes:

Amount of walking required varies as it depends on where the catamaran is docked; however, it can be as far as a half mile each direction. Terrain includes a marine ramp from the pier to the boat, which can be very steep at low tide. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. A Voyage into the Past: Magellan's Discovery

Only 18 members survived Magellan’s 1519 expedition, which circumnavigated the globe and put Tierra del Fuego on the map. The territory you’ll cover today played a significant role in Magellan’s epic voyage, and your outing will introduce you to the saga and the first inhabitants of Fireland (Tierra del Fuego).

Your guide will first show you some points of interest in **Punta Arenas**, the southernmost city in the world, but the major highlights are found in the rugged, scenic beauty outside of the city.

You will head to the **Nao Victoria Museum**, which contains a life-size replica of Ferdinand Magellan’s ship -- the vessel in which he circumnavigated the globe. The ship replica recreates all the original structural features and, unlike many museums, offers a very tactile experience, as visitors are encouraged

to hear the sounds of yesteryear and touch the replica everyday objects, including navigation instruments and artillery.

The next stop is at the **Maggiorino Borgatello Museum**, founded by Salesian missionaries. This facility provides a comprehensive overview of regional flora and fauna, the habitat of the local indigenous people, and local history.

From here, you will drive to the **Cerro la Cruz viewpoint** and take in the same view of the Strait of Magellan that Ferdinand Magellan himself had when he was here. You’ll also see the port and the legendary Tierra del Fuego Island -- known as Fireland.

On your way back to town, stop at **Plaza de Armas** (the main square) before returning to the pier.

Terrain includes a long flight of stairs to reach some of the displays at the Maggiorino Borgatello Museum. At the Nao Victoria Museum most of the exhibit interpretive panels are written in Spanish only.

Flight of the Condor: An Up-Close Encounter

Accompanied by specialist researchers, you’ll witness these majestic birds through powerful telescopes and professional binoculars.

Follow a short, flat path approximately 600 yards to the base of the hill. Here, a rock wall serves as the condors’ roost. Feel the anticipation as you approach these remarkable creatures in their natural habitat. Using your smartphone or standard format camera, take "trophy photos" of the Andean Condors through the telescope -- a chance to immortalize this awe-inspiring encounter.

Fort Bulnes: The Colonization of Patagonia

A beautifully scenic road skirts the Strait of Magellan on a one-hour drive to **Fort Bulnes National Monument**. Bulnes was founded in 1843 by 22 adventurers who took possession of the Strait of Magellan on behalf of the Chilean government. They named the area after Manuel Bulnes, President of the young Republic of Chile. They originally built the fort to protect Southern Chile and the Strait of Magellan from claims by other countries.

Walk with your guide over the site to see the church, chaplain’s quarters, jail, powder magazine, post office and stables. Everything is in amazingly good condition, and you can readily imagine life in this windswept part of the world. This location also offers one of the most majestic views of the strait from Punta

Santa Ana.

You will have a short amount of **free time** to take photos or purchase souvenirs before returning to the pier.

Kayaking the Strait of Magellan

Start kayaking on the **Strait of Magellan** and get comfortable with your equipment and technique. During this adventurous ride, you will experience direct contact with nature and water, navigate among local birds such as

seagulls, ducks, caiquenes, cormorants and quetros, and you may even be joined by the friendly Austral or Commerson’s dolphins that seasonally migrate to this coastal area.

Cross the Strait of Magellan to Isla Magdalena and Isla Marta. Together, these islands form the **Los Pingüinos National Monument**, which protects more than 150,000 penguins as well as a small colony of sea lions.

The islands create an interesting ecosystem -- Marta Island is home to more than 1,000 sea lions, along with cormorants, skuas, Austral seagulls, Antarctic pigeons and sea elephants. You can’t step ashore on Marta due to local regulations, so you will circumnavigate to admire and photograph both the colony and the diversity of marine birds that live there.

On **Magdalena Island**, you will go ashore and interact with one of the major colonies of **Magellan penguins** -- more than 150,000 birds -- spending an hour walking among the colony.

Notes:

A substantial colony of **Magellan penguins** nests and breeds here. These penguins return every year to this spot between October and March to lay eggs and raise their young. They bury their eggs in sandy burrows and under shrubs; most of the chicks will have hatched at this time of year. The animals are naturally curious but untamed; they will scamper into their burrows or try to reach the water if approached too quickly.

A **snack pack** is provided.

You will have about **one hour on the island** to observe the curious and entertaining penguins. Then, it’s time for the invigorating **walk** back to the catamaran and the return to Punta Arenas.

Watch as the gauchos round up a flock of sheep with their well-trained dogs. Step into the barn for a sheep-shearing demonstration - it looks easy from a spectator perspective!

A **barbecue lunch of tasty Patagonian lamb**, grilled slowly for hours on poles around the fire, is a delicious and memorable way to end the day.

Relax on the 50-mile drive back to the ship.

Travel to Valparaíso, well known for its impressive architecture and its mention in *Moby Dick* by Herman Melville. Today, you will see the old, hilly part of **Valparaíso** and the impressive downtown section.

Set out on a drive up the hillside to **Los Cerros, the upper town**. Spread along the narrow streets of 42 hills is an eclectic array of fine mansions, tattered houses and shacks. Stop at the Paseo 21 de Mayo promenade to take in superb views over the city and bay.

Your coach will descend to **El Plan, the lower part of town** adjacent to the port area. Pass the Naval Headquarters building that dominates Plaza Sotomayor and the impressive Monument to the Heroes of Iquique. Crossing the historical business center, watch for the majestic buildings belonging to now-defunct banks. Your guide will point out the El Mercurio building, which houses the oldest operational newspaper in Chile, along with the Stock Exchange, Public Library and the cathedral at Plaza Victoria.

Climbing into the hills by way of Alemania

Avenue, you will see the city from another point of view. Experience a **ride** on two of the amazing *ascensores* , or **funiculars** -- quite unique in style.

Head to **La Sebastiana** -- one of the museum houses of Nobel Prize winner Pablo Neruda. You'll appreciate its astonishing construction and the enormous variety of objects found here.

At **Cerro Alegre**, enjoy set menu lunch before descending to El Plan and returning to the ship in San Antonio.

In the '70s, it was home to nautical activities, including a famous motorboat race and a water-skiing competition organized by the **El Quisco Yacht Club**. Visit this club and relax over a light refreshment.

Take photos of the beautiful beach and bay before returning to San Antonio.

View the Naval Headquarters building and the impressive Monument to the Heroes of Iquique. Numerous fine old office buildings flank the narrow streets strung along the edge of the bay. Ancient Cultures of Easter Island

Your excursion begins with a visit to the **ceremonial site of Tahai**, located on the west coast of the island. This is where you will find the altars and monolithic **Moai statues** that have become the icons of Rapa Nui culture.

Next, head to **Rano Kau**, the **volcano** closest to the village of Hanga Roa. From the mirador (viewpoint), you'll have a great view of a crater and its lake, whose microclimate promotes the growth of dense, varied vegetation.

A short drive brings you to one of the most outstanding and enigmatic places on the island -- the **ceremonial village of Orongo**. This was once a small huddle of 52 houses built from flagstone, where the celebration of the birdman culture (*tangata manu*) and a related competition took place.

Deep into Easter Island's Culture

Easter Island is best known for its mysterious statues that have puzzled archaeologists and historians from all over the world. The "other half" of Easter Island's fascination is its friendly inhabitants of Polynesian origin, who are eager to show visitors some of their culture. **The Rapa Nui people** are most willing to tell you about their ancient traditions and, at the same time, allow you to participate in their ceremony of body painting.

From the port of Hanga Piko, you'll head to the **Tahai area**, located on the west coast of the island. The altars and monolithic **Moai statues** found here are the embodiment of

Rapa Nui culture. Your guide will explain the site and allow time for photos.

Afterward, take a short walk to meet your **Rapa Nui** hosts. During your time with these gentle people, they will teach you about their tribal dances. You'll also learn about *kaikai* -- the traditional game that expounds Rapa Nui history with the help of a piece of thread that is used to form different shapes in the hands - and the use of kie'a. The latter is a form of natural paint that was used in ancient times for **body painting** (*takona*). You're invited to participate and have your body painted if you wish, or you can simply observe how it is done.

| <p>lifetime visit.</p> <p>This special day begins with a 30-minute drive from Hanga Piko pier to Ahu Akivi. Akivi is the postcard-perfect site where seven nearly identical moai statues, each 14 feet tall, stand equidistant apart on an <i>ahu</i> (platform or plinth). Dating back to about 1442, the <i>ahu</i> was restored in the 1950s. Take all the photos you want at this eerie and impressive spot, whose origin is both debatable and fascinating.</p> <p>Next, head to Anakena Beach -- the venue for an amazing, traditional meal cooked underground in a Polynesian umu -- an earth oven. Each of the many countries within the Polynesian Triangle has its own version of the earth oven. Easter Island's version involves workers starting the day before the meal, digging a hole, and placing the stones heated to cook the food. On the day of the meal, the same workers return to the hole, light a fire to heat the stones, place the meat and vegetables over the stones, and cover them all with the leaves. Then, they fill in the hole with dirt and allow the ingredients to cook and steam underground for many hours. You, the discerning gourmand, arrive 24 hours after the process began, just in time to watch the earth oven being dug up and to savor every bite of an absolutely delicious, succulent <i>umu</i> feast whose sublime flavors, the locals say, fall squarely at the feet of the gods. Worth the wait? After filling your camera with trophy photos, begin the trek back down to the motorcoach.

On your way back to the pier, you will pass Ahu Akivi with its seven statues, all directly facing the sunset during the spring and autumn equinoxes.

On the south shore of Taapuna Passage, keep an eye out for local and international surfers hanging ten and catching waves.

The crew will drop the anchor in clear waters inside the lagoon, with plenty of time to enjoy a **swim and snorkel**. Gear is provided. Access to the water is by way of a large, easy stepladder.

Towel off afterward and settle in on the catamaran's deck or nets. Kick back, unwind and enjoy a **refreshment** as you sail through turquoise waters on the way home.

Board a **4x4 vehicle** for a great adventure deep into the unspoiled interior of Tahiti. Let the adventure begin!

A scenic drive along the east coast of Tahiti turns inland at the mouth of Papenoo River into the famous Papenoo Valley. On the ascent, you're following the largest valley on the island, and the view of the surrounding mountainsides carved by centuries of erosion

and covered with rich, thick, multi-green rainforest is quite awesome in the true sense of the word.

The adventurous route crosses rivers and includes photo stops at numerous **waterfalls**. You will also visit an **archaeological site** to view sacred temple remains from yesteryear, well before the arrival of Western missionaries.

Take a **swim** in one of the natural river pools (water levels permitting) before retracing your path down the valley. Pause at a black-sand beach near Point Venus en route to the pier.

With a little luck, as you set out by **boat**, you will see schools of acrobatic spinner dolphins. At the same time, an excellent commentary provides details on the remarkable life and society of these wonderful mammals. Learn about the geology of French Polynesia while viewing the dramatic beauty of Moorea from the water. Dolphins are found on 95% of the tours, but the thoroughness of the explanations and the sheer magnificence of **Moorea’s coastline** will ensure a rewarding

time for all, even on those few occasions when no dolphins are found.

Between July and the beginning of November, there is the additional chance of viewing the humpback whales that maintain a seasonal presence to mate and calf here.

The tour operator follows international ecotourism guidelines and is an active contributor to the conservation of French Polynesia’s dolphins and whales. Participation in this tour will help to further this goal.

Time permitting, you can enjoy an optional swim stop at the end of the tour.

The swim stop requires a water entry directly from the boat and is not a swim with the dolphins. these products and visit the gift shop for island souvenirs and gifts.

Thanks to its short draft, you will be amazed where your maxi catamaran can take you -- shallow lagoon waters and close-up views of the shore are the norm.

Get your hands on the wheel while the crew sets up the sails for magnificent sailing along the in-shore reef. Feel the sea breeze as you discover the lush and appealing scenery of

Moorea. Cross the reef through the passage and see an amazing mix of blue and green water, overwater bungalows and local houses -- the stuff of gorgeous photos.

At a **swim** stop, a mask and **snorkel** are provided. Access to the water is made by way of a large, easy stepladder that makes getting into and out of the water a snap. This sandy area boasts tiki-carved stones, which are worth a visit.

Next, you will be ready to explore the unspoiled **coral gardens** by the barrier reef, where ideal conditions have encouraged maximum coral growth. After donning a mask and **snorkel**, enter water that is four to five feet deep and swim amid the marine life. Underwater sightings may include butterfly fish, groupers and hundreds of other rainbow-colored species.

You'll witness the full force of the *haka* as you head down the tunnel and onto the field in the stadium full of screaming fans. But this isn't just any haka -- it's a four-meter-high screen virtual experience that you will see as only the opposing team sees it.

Strap on some gear and show the players your **skills in the passing and kicking cages**, as well as the agility course, created especially to see if you have what it takes to (almost) be an All Black.

Look up and you will see the millions of bioluminescent glow-worms that stick to the roof of the cave. Because the worms extinguish their lights when disturbed, silence is mandatory; however, the sight is so awesome, you will be at quite a loss for words anyway.

Thirty minutes from the cave is **Crosshills Farm**. You will stop here to see a beautiful country garden and to enjoy a home-cooked **lunch** accompanied by splendid local **wine**. The typical kiwi hospitality is offered by your hosts, Debbie and Fraser Robertson, and matches the delicious food.

At the completion of your tour, relax and enjoy a panoramic motorcoach drive back to Auckland.

Glow-Worm Cave & Puketi Kauri Forest

Northland is one of the least-traveled areas of New Zealand, and this excursion provides a good overview of the **Bay of Islands**. Travel by motorcoach on a 30-minute **panoramic drive** through an interesting mix of farmland dotted with native trees and expansive views.

Your destination is the limestone **Kawiti Cavern**, which features a **glow-worm grotto**. The caves, located on private property, are owned by descendants of Maori chieftain Kawiti, who fought the British in 1846. The glow-worm (*Arachnocampa luminosa*) belongs to the gnat family. Its dazzling bioluminescent larvae form a constellation of lights, and demand complete silence as they will extinguish their lights in self-defense if you should so much as sneeze or cough. With the help of your guide, you will see natural underground caverns and the magnificent, delicate **stalactite** and **stalagmite formations** within. A small stream flows through the cave.

Don't miss **Kawakawa** -- the 'Train Town' of the Bay of Islands, nicknamed for the vintage railway that runs down the middle of its main street. Oddly, this town is most celebrated for its **public restrooms**, designed by Austrian architect/artist Friedensreich Hundertwasser - a former local resident. Check out the feted privy and enjoy some **free time** to explore Kawakawa on your own.

Not far away is the **Puketi Forest**, which once covered most of the Bay of Islands with massive kauri trees. Now protected in large reserves, these magnificent trees rival California's redwoods in height and girth. A **guided walk** on a forest boardwalk affords you the opportunity to marvel at these imposing trees. Nearly 50,000 visitors annually use the elevated wooden walkway, which protects the kauris' sensitive feeding roots, yet allows visitors to get up close to the ancient trees of the forest.

Your tour concludes with a scenic drive through Kerikeri on your way back to the wharf. With the Bay of Islands behind you, you'll take home a myriad of memories from a great day out.

Cross the Waitangi Bridge and pass Haruru Falls en route to picturesque Kerikeri.

Visit the **Stone Store** (ground floor only) and **Kemp House**. These are the two oldest buildings in New Zealand. Kemp House was built for the Missionary Society of London in 1819.

Enjoy a **morning snack** as you take in the views of the Waitangi River.

Travel to the **Waitangi Treaty House** where, in 1840, the British Crown and many Maori chiefs of New Zealand signed the Treaty of Waitangi -- the founding document of

modern New Zealand.

During your guided tour of the Waitangi grounds, you'll view New Zealand history from a Maori perspective and discover the impact of the Treaty on Maori and on this young country's culture. Step inside the Georgian-style **house** that was the home to James Busby from 1832 to 1840. A huge waka, or war canoe, is drawn up on the beach below the house.

Before calling it a day, you'll visit the gift shop for locally-made jewelry, ceramics and New Zealand-themed souvenirs.

Continue through the pretty town of **Kerikeri**, well known for its citrus orchards.

A special highlight will be a visit to a traditional marae or meeting place. A drive through the lush green Northland countryside leads to the **marae**. Here you will

experience a special welcome after entering the carved meetinghouse. The elders of the tribe will explain the carvings and the traditions of the Maori people. They trace their ancestry back to the earliest canoe voyages to New Zealand from Polynesia. A light **refreshment** is served.

Return to the Bay of Islands via Waimate North, where, for a short time in the late 1830s and early 1840s, the influential Anglican Church established its New Zealand headquarters.

Finally, visit the many locations around the **Waitangi Reserve** where Maori ancestors fiercely debated the Treaty of Waitangi -- New Zealand's founding document. A viewpoint overlooks the treaty house grounds.

The exhibition space includes the *Bombing of Darwin Experience* -- a major interpretive theater production that offers visitors a sense of what it must have been like to witness firsthand the bombing of Darwin in 1942.

It is both a significant **wetlands area** and part of a network of World War II military sites established during the development of Darwin as Australia's northern defense line. Ba Ria: A Local Life Experience

Located a short distance inland from Phu My Port is the untouched rural area of **Ba Ria Province**. This area has seen little in the way of urban development and many inhabitants continue to lead their lives the way they have for generations.

You will visit a **pagoda** and drive past the local marketplace for a glimpse of everyday local life. Next, you'll have the rare opportunity to enter a **local home**. As in nearly all Vietnamese homes, a series of altars stands proudly in memory of deceased family members. The owners welcome a visit from outsiders and are pleased to talk about their simple but tradition-rich lifestyle. For all Vietnamese, rice is the staple diet, but it can also be made into many different forms.

See the **process of rice paper making** and a **distillery** producing the local moonshine -- a potent form of rice wine.

Finally, step inside a colorful **Cao Dai temple**. This religion was officially founded in 1926, and within a year, the group had 26,000 followers. By the mid-1950s eight percent of South Vietnamese were Cao Daist. Founded in an attempt to create the ideal religion

through a fusion of secular and religious philosophies of East and West, Cao Daism is a fascinating combination of Buddhism, Confucianism, Taoism, Hinduism, native Vietnamese spirituality, Christianity and Islam. Look out for the official Cao Dai symbol -- the 'divine' eye -- inset into the front of the temple above the altar.

A **panoramic drive** from Phu My leads through pretty countryside dotted with rice fields and rubber plantations. The main 'highway' is packed with bicycles, heavily laden buses, and people making their way to market.

Get acquainted with the major highlights of bustling **Ho Chi Minh City**, still commonly referred to as **Saigon**. Among the grand old buildings, you will see colorful markets selling everything from chilies to French baguettes.

The former **Presidential Palace** is now known as **Independence Palace**. This historic building was made famous when a North Vietnamese tank crashed through its front gates in 1975, signaling the end of the

Vietnam War. Your tour will include a visit to the reception and dining rooms. In the basement, ancient American-made telecommunications equipment is still in place, and military maps line the walls.

Drive by the Notre Dame Cathedral -- a neo-Classical structure dating back to the 19th century. The imposing twin spires have long heralded arrival in Saigon to ships traveling the winding Saigon River.

Visit the **Saigon Central Post Office**, notable for its perfect combination of neo-Classical European architecture and Asian décor.

Enjoy a buffet **lunch** of Asian and Western dishes at a local hotel.

Visit the **History Museum**. Built in 1929, this facility houses an excellent collection of artifacts illustrating the evolution of the cultures of Vietnam, from the Bronze Age Dong Son civilization to Cham, Khmer and modern-day Vietnam.

Browse, shop, and observe at a **lacquerware workshop** before returning to Phu My port.

Cu Chi Tunnels

A comfortable motorcoach transports you from Phu My into the surrounding countryside.

As you approach **Cu Chi**, it is hard to believe you are entering what was once a war zone of incredible strategic importance. This tour focuses on the ingenuity and resilience of the Vietnamese fighters who both lived and fought from underground tunnels.

Originally constructed as a means to fight against the French by the Viet Minh, the Cu Chi Tunnels were later expanded up to 36 feet below ground in hard soil using only rudimentary tools. Most tunnels were only 2 - 2.5 feet wide and 4.5 feet tall, with thick roofs capable of withstanding the weight of tanks or the impact of bombs.

Using dioramas, your guide will explain the underground network. On display are some of the tools and weapons used by the guerrilla fighters. Much of the tunnel complex is now open and ventilated so that you can more easily experience the underground meeting rooms, kitchens, hospitals, and sleeping areas.

More adventurous and agile tunnel explorers can experience an **unlit passage**, which has not been enlarged for the comfort of visitors. See if you can find the hidden tunnel

entrances and learn about the ingenious methods Vietnamese soldiers employed to remain undetected and frustrate their enemies.

Lunch is served during the tour.

Refreshments (at your own expense) and souvenirs are available in the nearby parking area, which also displays some military paraphernalia.

The interpretive panels present information from a Vietnamese perspective. After the fall of Saigon, the guerrilla fighters were considered heroes and still are by many older Vietnamese people; while the portrayal of their story may be at odds with American sentiment, it is nonetheless an interesting visit. Wear sturdy non-skid walking shoes. Bring sunscreen and insect repellent. Guests visiting lower levels of the tunnels may get dirty or dusty. Board a coach for the approximately one-hour drive to **Tainan**.

Your first destination is the **Chikan Towers** -- among the most important historical sites in Taiwan. The two ornate stone towers are built atop the ruins of Dutch Fort Provintia and are surrounded by elegant gardens and koi ponds. Tainan's Confucius Temple was consecrated in 1666 and symbolized the establishment of Chinese control over Taiwan. The current shrine dates from 1917 and commemorates the general who vanquished the Dutch.

After **lunch**, continue to **Lotus Lake** to look closely at Taiwan's knack for synthesizing old and new. The pagodas, pavilions and temples here all boast classical architecture, yet the oldest dates back only to 1951. Explore the Spring and Autumn Pavilions dedicated to the God of War. The graceful Dragon and Tiger Pagodas feature interiors decorated with paintings depicting China's 24 Obedient Sons.

The **Tzu-Chi Temple** is a magnificent Taoist shrine -- its interior is filled with phantasmagorical depictions of the pantheon of Taoist deities.

En route back to the ship, you'll stop to photograph the Great Harbor Bridge (the **Dagang Bridge**). It is the longest cross-port

revolving bridge in Asia. With its cable stays and stunning, eclectic eyelid design incorporating shells and dolphins, it is daringly avant-garde and eminently discussable. Admire the nearby public art piece, Echo Across the Harbor, by Dutch bell manufacturer Royal Eijsbouts.

Chikan Tower & Koxigna Shrine

This half-day excursion is dedicated to three cultural and historical landmarks of Tainan -- Taiwan's oldest city. At the end of the 16th century, the Dutch East India Company established a trade base here, and Tainan was the island's capital for more than 200 years. That distinction eventually transferred to Taipei, but many of the city's most celebrated landmarks remain.

Begin with a 60-minute drive to **Tainan**. You'll see many Dutch and Chinese influences here.

The **Chikan Towers** are among the most important historical sites in Taiwan, built atop the ruins of Dutch Fort Provintia.

Elegant gardens and koi ponds surround the two ornate stone towers. A noteworthy landmark here is the **Confucius Temple** -- the country's oldest. Built in 1666 at the end of the Manchu Dynasty, the temple served as Taiwan's first official school. The impressive temple you see today is the result of a 1917 restoration undertaken when Taiwan was part of the Japanese Empire. Check out the graceful banyan trees and two ceremonial gates that symbolize the main disciplines of Confucianism.

Your final stop is at the **Koxinga Shrine** (1874), dedicated to the Chinese General who led his troops against the Dutch and successfully ousted them from Taiwan. Outside is a beautiful garden; inside is the Tainan Folk Cultural Hall, with a number of fascinating exhibits tracing Tainan's history and culture.

Return to the ship afterward.

A 30-minute drive brings you to **Lotus Lake** for a closer look at Taiwan's knack for synthesizing old and new. Completed in the 1970s, it boasts an interior filled with wildly fantastic depictions of the pantheon of Taoist deities.

Next up is a short **ferry** ride to **Chijin Island**, with views of the city's soaring skyline. Chijin Island is the city's oldest district and was occupied by the Dutch in the 17th century. Seafood restaurants and small shops line the island's streets, and Chijin is also home to Taiwan's second-oldest lighthouse (1883).

More than 300 years old, the **Tian Ho Temple** is Kaohsiung's oldest temple.

Glimpse remnants of Western influence at the island's Christian church and enjoy some **free time to shop for souvenirs** and visit the fish stalls.

En route back to the ship, you'll stop to photograph the pedestrian-only Great Harbor Bridge (the **Dagang Bridge**). It is the longest cross-port revolving bridge in Asia. With its cable stays and stunning, eclectic eyelid design incorporating shells and dolphins, it is daringly avant-garde and eminently

discussable. Admire the nearby public art piece, Echo Across the Harbor, by Dutch bell manufacturer Royal Eijsbouts.

Giant Buddha statues welcome you to the **Fo Guang Shan Monastery**, a one-hour drive from Kaohsiung. Founded in 1967 by the venerable master Hsing Yun, Fo Guang Shan is the best-known Buddhist center in southern Taiwan and is the largest Buddhist monastery in Taiwan.

Continue to the **Buddha Memorial Center**, covering more than 247 acres. Its design is inspired by both an Indian stupa and the Mahabodhi Temple inside the Bodhgaya religious site in India. Above it sits the world's tallest bronze sitting Buddha statue. The center opened in 2011 and was designed to promote cultural and religious education. Four stupas symbolize the Four Noble Truths of Buddhism, while the eight Chinese pavilions denote the Eightfold Path. The last remaining of Buddha's teeth is housed in a special shrine within.


After a **vegetarian lunch**, board your coach for the return drive to **Kaohsiung**.

Visit **Lotus Lake** for a closer look at Taiwan's knack for synthesizing old and new. The pagodas, pavilions and temples here all boast classical architecture, yet the oldest dates back only to 1951. Explore the Spring and Autumn Pavilions dedicated to the God of War.

The **Tzu-Chi Temple** is a magnificent Taoist shrine. Completed in the 1970s, it boasts an interior filled with wildly fantastic depictions of the pantheon of Taoist deities.

Before heading back to port, you'll pause at the Kaohsiung Martyrs' Shrine, originally built during Japanese rule but spruced up in Chinese style in the 1970s and expanded to reflect Taiwan's complicated recent and ancient history. The front of the Shrine is covered in greenery and embraces a beautiful view of the harbor below.

The Buddhist Monastery at Fo Guang Shan

The founder of Buddhism, Siddhartha Gautama, was born more than 2,500 years ago in what is now Southern Nepal. Today, there are 300 million Buddhists worldwide, with five million followers in Taiwan alone. Discover the history of this age-old religion with a **walk** through the countryside just outside of Kaohsiung.

Your journey begins with a relaxing 60-minute **panoramic drive** north to the **Fo Guang Shan Monastery** -- Buddha's Light Mountain. Resting in a bamboo forest at the foot of the mountain, the monastery is home to a complex of structures devoted to the practice of humanistic Buddhism, which applies Buddha's core principles to daily life. Giant Buddha statues welcome you to the largest Buddhist monastery (1967) in Taiwan.

Continue to the **Buddha Memorial Center**, covering more than 247 acres. The design is inspired by both an Indian stupa and the Mahabodhi Temple inside the Bodhgaya

religious site in India. Above it sits the world's tallest bronze sitting Buddha statue. In front of the statue is the Way to Buddhahood path flanked by Eight Pagodas on either side. The center opened in 2011 to promote cultural and religious education. The **Cultural Museum** here is Taiwan's only museum specializing in Buddhist artifacts. The Buddha Memorial Center houses a relic said to be Buddha's tooth -- one of only three in the entire world -- as well as many Buddhist artifacts donated by various countries. The art gallery displays an array of historical and cultural treasures, including poetry, calligraphy, religious instruments, and antiques.

Return to your transport for the scenic trip back to the pier with a deeper understanding and appreciation of Buddhism.

Back on the road, head through the bustling city of **Taipei**. Explore the **Lungshan Temple**, built during the Ching dynasty and devoted to worshipping the Goddess of Mercy. Marvel at the temple’s beautifully-crafted wooden doors, stone and bronze beams, and dragon-shaped poles.

Enjoy a feast for the senses at the stately **Grand Hotel**, built in 1952 in the decadent style of classic Chinese architecture. Ronald Reagan and Dwight D. Eisenhower both stayed here. Today, it’s your turn to relax and savor the **lunch buffet** of more than 100 dishes that combine Chinese, Western, and Japanese delicacies to tempt your taste buds. An open-style kitchen allows diners to enjoy

fresh and diverse foods and appreciate the skill of the chef at the same time.

At the **National Palace Museum**, take in one of the world’s largest collections of ancient Chinese objects and art. Spanning more than 8,000 years, the impressive collection includes bronze, paintings, jade, ceramics, and precious objects amassed by emperors from the Sung, Yuan, Ming and Qing dynasties.

Next, head to **Chiang Kai-Shek Memorial Hall** -- a regal monument paying tribute to the former President. With its brilliant blue glazed-tile roof, gold apex, white marble and natural red cypress ceiling, the shrine is designed to convey sacredness, solemnity, hospitality and peace. Inside, discover valuable artifacts related to the late president’s life, including photographs, cars and historical documents.

Travel to **Pao-An Temple**, dedicated to Pashen Tati, the god of medicine in local folk religion. The temple was built more than 230 years ago. It is one of the island’s oldest and contains many ornate and intricate carvings. Look closely at the columns decorated with

ferocious, writhing dragons and marvel at the ceilings adorned with woodcarvings of lions, flowers and figures from Chinese mythology.

You will also see the Confucius Temple, dedicated to the great Chinese philosopher whose teachings still influence modern Chinese life today.

Continue to **Lin An-Tai** -- an old house with a Chinese courtyard and elegant decorative embellishments. This is one of the few traditional houses remaining in northern Taiwan, built by the Lin family, who were wealthy traders in the 18th century. The crescent-shaped pond in front of the building was used for defense, for raising fish, for firefighting, as a water supply, and to moderate the surrounding temperature. At more than 160 years old, Lin An-Tai is Taipei’s best-preserved and -maintained Chinese-era house.

A stop at **Dihua Street** allows you to explore the 150-year-old center of commerce. It’s still the most popular place in Taipei for residents to buy snacks and sweets for Chinese New Year festivities.

Visit **Peace Memorial Park** is located in the southern part of Okinawa’s “mainland,” where the last conflicts of the Battle of Okinawa occurred. The **Peace Memorial Museum**, established in 2000, interprets a range of individual war experiences. Its purpose is to pass on the message about the devastation of war and the importance of human life.

The **Himeyuri Peace Museum** features exhibits on the female students who were mobilized to nurse soldiers, providing insights into their roles during the war.

Next, you’ll visit the **former Japanese Naval Headquarters**, set in an underground shelter. At the end of the war, Commander Minoru Ohta and other officers committed suicide in the shelter. It remains unaltered to this day.

Continue to the **Okinawa Prefectural Peace Memorial Museum**. In 1945, a fierce battle took place on these islands. The “typhoon of steel” lasted 90 days and disfigured mountains, destroyed much of the local cultural legacy, and claimed the lives of more than 200,000 people.

The **Battle of Okinawa** was the only ground battle fought on Japanese soil and was also the largest-scale campaign of the Asia-Pacific War. Even Okinawa’s civilians were fully mobilized. A significant aspect of the Battle of Okinawa was the great loss of civilian life. The Okinawan experience of war gave rise to the construct of the “Okinawan Heart” -- a term that describes resilience and personal dignity. Okinawans reject acts of war and cherish their own culture. The Cornerstone of Peace monument stands as a symbol of their loss. At **Memorial Park**, you will glimpse the numerous marble memorials dedicated to

those who lost their lives in the Battle of Okinawa.

Amami (Naze), Amami Oshima, Japan - Wednesday, April 8, 2026:

Amami Cycads & Silk

Amami Island's surface is more than 80 percent tree-covered. Rare animals and colorful birds share the beautiful surroundings with blooming flowers and mangrove trees.

One of the most important and conspicuous plant species on the island is the **Amami cycad**, which grows along the coastal areas. The cycad plants seem delicate but are actually quite resilient and have been around since the Jurassic era. The cycad (*Cycas revolute*) and the plant is closely associated with the indigenous people of Amami. From the cycad fruit, islanders produce soybean paste, miso, mochi and rice cakes. Today, the cycad is listed as a threatened species on the IUCN Red List.

Continue to the **Amami Oshima Tsumugi Village**. Oshima Tsumugi is a high-quality silk fabric with a 1,300-year history. You will see the process involved in making this textile and hear about the background of the techniques used. The delicate, hand-woven fabric with intricate patterns is used to make traditional kimonos.

Finish up at the **Hamachidorikan Shochu Brewery**. Brown sugar is used the way molasses is used in rum, but shochu has a mild flavor and, surprisingly, is not too sweet. In theory, it also doesn't cause a hangover. Watch how the distilled Shochu liquor is

made, and be sure to sample some before you leave.

Enjoy some delightfully unspoiled scenery as you stop for photos at **Cape Ayamaru** -- a visual exploration of some of the island's fascinating terrain. The geological formations around Amami Oshima can be clearly seen from this location. On a clear day, the views are quite dramatic.

At **Amami Park**, discover a cultural center that welcomes many visitors to the island. An information area provides background on the wildlife, history, culture and industry of

Amami, and an audiovisual entitled *Jewel of the Subtropics -- the Story of Amami's Seas & Forests* will introduce you to the unique flora and fauna of the region.

You won't want to miss the **Tanaka Isson Memorial Museum of Art**, located on the park's grounds. The museum showcases the works of one of Japan's master painters who was enamored with the beauty of Amami and spent the last 20 years of his life capturing its splendor.

The Amamino-Sato contains a number of visual displays and life-size exhibits bringing to life the natural history and culture of the island.

Complete your day, with a relaxing ride back to port.

Southern Amami

This half-day adventure, exploring the region's natural and cultural wonders, begins with a scenic drive across **Amami Oshima**. Amami is the second-largest remote island in Japan and designated a quasi-National Park.

The waters surrounding the island are turquoise blue, punctuated by brightly-colored coral reefs and inhabited by tropical fish. The foliage in the forest that dominates the island's interior is lush and dense.

Located on the Pacific Ocean side of the island, **Honohoshi Beach** stands out because its coastline is comprised of rare, round stones instead of sand. To complement this stark landscape, large rock formations rise up from the cobalt-blue water, making for truly striking photographs.

The ocean's majesty is celebrated in your next adventure as well -- a **semi-submarine boat** excursion. Amami Oshima is known for some of the best scuba diving in the world, and this is a great opportunity to see the coral reefs and abundant marine life up close without getting wet. From the observation deck you will peer below sea level for up-close views, which are exceptional in this crystal-clear water (weather permitted).

Continue to **Amami Oshima World Heritage Conservation Center** -- the northernmost mangrove ecosystem in the world. This virgin mangrove forest dominates more than 172 acres. Keep a lookout for the rare indigenous jaybird known as Ruri-kakesu.

At the completion of this day of natural beauty, enjoy the relaxing drive back to the port.

Arita Porcelain & Nagasaki Peace Park

Set out from the pier on a scenic drive to the **Arita** area, famous for the porcelain of the same name that is well known in Japan and around the world.

Your first visit is to the **Kyushu Ceramic Museum**. This museum, opened in 1980, was constructed for the purpose of collecting and exhibiting porcelain, researching the history of local kilns, and disseminating ceramic culture. You'll also see one of the kilns used for firing the porcelain. You will have a chance to purchase some pottery before proceeding to **lunch** at a local restaurant.

Drive back to Nagasaki city to visit **Nagasaki Peace Park**. The park is located only a few minutes' walk from the epicenter of the Nagasaki atomic bomb blast of 1945. Nagasaki Peace Park is dedicated to world peace and occupies more than eight acres in the middle of a city where land is the most precious resource. It features a large fountain and different statues and sculptures donated by various countries and artists around the world.

Return to the pier at the conclusion of your tour.

You'll walk from here to the bomb blast epicenter, a few minutes away, to visit the **Atomic Bomb Museum**. This interesting facility houses numerous photographs and relics of that fateful day.

Ride the **Nagasaki Slope Car** to the **Mt Inasa observation platform**. The summit features a glass-enclosed circular, domed lookout from which you can enjoy a 360-degree view of the spectacular scenery below. On a clear day, you may even catch a glimpse of Mt Unzen, the Amakusa area, and the Gotoh archipelago

Today, you will visit **Nagasaki Peace Park**, created in remembrance of the atomic bomb explosion on August 9, 1945.

Conclude with a trip to the **Atomic Bomb Museum** and Hypocenter before returning to the pier.

Another area contains a reconstruction of part of the Tateyama Government Branch of the Nagasaki Magistrate's Office. Two must-see exhibits are the crime notebooks from the Magistrate's Office and the macabre 'trample tablets' used in the persecution of Christians.

Nagasaki Peace Park and its famous statue are located only a few minutes' walk from the epicenter of the atomic bomb blast of 1945. The park is dedicated to world peace, and here you will visit the **Atomic Bomb Museum** -- home to numerous photographs and relics of that fateful day.

You'll begin with a **drive through Hakodate city** itself; then, the coach will head up to the viewpoint on Mt Hakodate. From the top, you can look back over the Hakodate Peninsula, with panoramic vistas of the city, the ocean and the horizon.

Drive past the Kanemori Red-Brick Warehouse District, remodeled in 1988 as part of a waterfront redevelopment project with a theme of combining the old and the new. Return to the ship, just a 30-minute drive away.

Notes:

The scenery is weather dependent. There are some steps at the Mt Hakodate observatory.

The Best of Hakodate

This morning, visit the **Goryokaku Tower** to view the fort's graceful pentagonal structure. It was built in 1864 to defend Hokkaido and is now surrounded by a public park.

Walk to the Hakodate Bugyosho, or **Magistrate's Office**, opened in 2010 in the middle of Goryokaku Park. It was rebuilt as a faithful copy of the original building using traditional methods. Remove your shoes, in keeping with Japanese custom, and step inside the building to view the historical exhibits.

You'll visit the **Hakodate Morning Market**, comprised of more than 250 stalls selling fresh seafood. It's a great opportunity to mingle with the locals and get a feel for the bustle of local commerce.

After **lunch** at a local restaurant, take the **aerial cableway** up **Mt Hakodate**. From the top, you can look back over the Hakodate Peninsula, viewing the city, the ocean and an endless panorama.

Back in town, you will visit the **Hakodate Museum of Northern People**, housed in the former Bank of Japan building (1926) and exhibiting precious artifacts of the Ainu or Aleut people.

Return to the ship at the end of your tour.

The aerial cableway operates weather permitting; the tour coach will be used to ascend the mountain if the cableway is closed. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Morning Markets are within walking distance from the ship pier, some groups will visit the markets first by walking, then continue on the remainder of the tour. Group may be split over multiple lunch venues.

Kodiak, Alaska, US - Friday, April 24, 2026: Kodiak Island has been home to the Alutiiq people for more than 7,500 years, but its most famous inhabitant is surely the enormous sub-species of grizzly known as the Kodiak brown bear. Some of these giants weigh 1500 pounds and stand ten feet tall. Apart from a larger-than-life animal kingdom, Kodiak also boasts legendary fishing, the noticeable influence of historic Russian America, and spotless green fjords.

A Walk through Kodiak Harbor

During this 90-minute **walking tour** along the waterfront of one of the largest fishing ports in the United States, you will step into the rough-and-ready world of Alaska's commercial fisheries.

A knowledgeable guide will lead you down **Cannery Row** to **Kodiak Harbor**, where you will encounter working commercial fishermen, boats and fishing gear. Along the way, you will hear life-and-death stories of Kodiak's commercial fishing fleet and, if fishermen are on the docks as you pass by, have a chat with them as they prepare their gear and boats for another commercial fishing trip. Learn about the different kinds of fishing vessels in Alaska and view crab pots, nets and hooks used to catch the crabs and fish off Alaska's coast. Observe the human activity on the docks and keep an eye out for bald eagles, harbor seals and Steller sea lions, which often frequent the harbor.

You'll also hear about the Great Alaska Earthquake and tsunami of 1964 that destroyed much of the town of Kodiak and its fishing fleet.

End your walk at the Harbormaster Building

in **downtown Kodiak** where, if you wish, you can leave the tour and spend some time exploring or **shopping** on your own.

Notes:

This walking tour begins at your ship and ends at the small boat harbor in downtown Kodiak. Participants must be able to walk for 90 minutes and be physically fit. This tour is entirely on foot and covers about 1.5 miles over city streets and on harbor floats. Some parts of the tour cross unpaved surfaces. Accessing the harbor floats requires descending a ramp that can be fairly steep at low tide. Not advisable for guests with mobility limitations. Minimum age is 10 years.

A short drive north brings you to **Fort Abercrombie State Park** -- a World War II historic site. Feel free to explore the old gun emplacements and the exterior of the bunker-style headquarters, and don't miss the beautiful views over land and sea.

Return to the ship to reflect on the events of the day.

Take in the view of Woody Island; then, you'll stop at **Mill Bay Beach** for photos and to stretch your legs.

Follow one of the oldest roads on Kodiak

back towards town, where the diversity of Kodiak's commercial center is evident. You'll pass the high-water mark from the 1964 tsunami on your way through the center of town.

From a scenic overlook, you will see a World War II pillbox bunker and take photos of your ship with the city in the background.

This unforgettable tour provides the opportunity to experience all three of Sitka's most popular wildlife viewing experiences.

Board an Alaskan-built expedition vessel and set out to explore the marine wilderness to observe sea otters, whales, Steller sea lions, porpoises, harbor seals, brown bears, black-tail deer, and a variety of marine birds. An onboard naturalist will explain the workings of this remarkable ecosystem as your skilled skipper maneuvers the vessel to provide the best possible views.

Take a short coach ride to the renowned **Alaska Raptor Center**, where injured birds of prey, including the American bald eagle, receive medical treatment. A wildlife interpreter will guide you through the Bald Eagle Flight Center and introduce you to some of the raptors-in-residence perched in outdoor habitats. Enjoy some **free time** to explore the river trail and use the interactive exhibits.

Your adventure continues with a narrated drive along a winding coastal road to Silver Bay's **Fortress of the Bear rescue facility**. Here, you can view and photograph brown and black bears up close from a raised platform and learn about an Alaskan family's dream of offering a life-saving alternative for bears caught in conflict with their human neighbors.

You may have **free time** to explore beautiful **Sitka** on your own after the tour.

Dry Suit Snorkel

Explore the **underwater world of Southeast Alaska** and learn about the marine biology of the ocean floor that teems with life in the waters of Sitka Sound. The advantages of using a dry suit are warmth, buoyancy, safety, comfort, and ease of changing -- you simply wear your own street clothes under the dry suit.

You will be picked up dockside for a transfer to the changing area. There is a secure place to leave your belongings. In your dry suit, you will head to **Magic Island**, located within the **Halibut Point Recreation State Park**.

Listen to a safety orientation, and your guide will answer any questions; Your guides provide information regarding the water temperatures, visibility, tidal fluctuations and local marine life. There is a 1:6 guide-to-guest ratio, and a certified dive master accompanies

the group. All guides are trained in CPR, dive and snorkel procedures, and the marine environment.

Then comes the once-in-a-lifetime and highly unusual experience of **snorkeling in the waters of Alaska**. You will spend approximately 30 - 60 minutes in the water watching for sea life such as sea stars, sun stars (up to 60 lbs), crabs, a variety of fish, sea anemones (one of the oldest animals on earth), a variety of filter feeders, sea urchins, sea cucumbers, and the colorful bio-mass of the sea floor. You can also explore the giant kelp forest near the snorkel area.

Head along a very scenic portion of the Sitka road system to the **Fortress of the Bear** to learn about the life and habits of the Alaska coastal brown bear (grizzlies). Visit **Sitka National Historical Park**, the site of

the 1804 Battle of Sitka. Learn how the Russian colonial period forever changed the lives of Native Americans. A large collection of Tlingit and Haida totems is on display throughout the park.

The Alaska Raptor Center is Alaska’s only full-service avian hospital and educational facility. Knowledgeable staff will greet you and introduce you to the facility. Visit the Bald Eagle Flight Training Center to view bald eagles in various stages of rehabilitation. See the clinic and meet the “raptors in residence,” including bald and golden eagles, owls, hawks and falcons in outdoor habitats.

If time allows, walk the quarter-mile nature trail along the Indian River and out across the muskeg.

Explore Sitka, Raptor Center & Native Tales

A brief **panoramic drive** through the **historic**

district showcases Totem Square and Castle Hill -- site of the 1867 purchase and land transfer ceremony of Alaska from colonial Russia. You'll also pass the Alaska Pioneer Home and the Russian Bishop's house.

Discover the **Alaska Raptor Center**, providing rehabilitative care for rescued birds with the goal of releasing them back into the wild. See the fascinating **eagle flight center** and view the clinic, outside deck habitat area, and owl habitats.

At **Sitka National Historical Park**, wander through the lush forest and along a scenic beach path where **totems** depict the rich culture of the southeast Alaska Native people. A short optional **walk** covers topics such as edible and medicinal plants, the life cycle and traditional uses of various salmon species, and rainforest ecology. Don't miss the park's **Visitor Center** featuring local Native artists when available, and view a fascinating audiovisual presentation on Sitka's history.

Experience an authentic **Tlingit Performance** of stories and/or songs in the traditional-style clan house. The Naa Kahídi Community House features the largest carved house screen in the Pacific Northwest. Admire the beautiful regalia clothing and even learn to speak a bit of Tlingit before you leave.

Your tour concludes downtown. Transfer back to the ship with your guide, or guests wishing to stay in town to shop or explore independently are welcome to do so but must make their own way back to the ship. Free shuttles back to the ship leave from Centennial Hall or the downtown lightering

(tendering) facility. You are welcome to visit St Michael's Cathedral -- the first Russian Orthodox cathedral in America -- to view priceless icons and religious artifacts.

Then, take to the water aboard an **expedition vessel** to explore a **glacier-carved fjord**. Along the way, you will step ashore at a remote **Alaskan homestead** where your camp hosts tell you about some of the first pioneers who came in search of riches and to make a living sustained by the area's natural resources. Enjoy spectacular views of the bay from the beach or while sitting around the **campfire**, complete with **s'mores and cocoa**.

Back aboard your expedition craft, you will cruise north in search of Steller sea lions and

other **wildlife** species common to the area. At Sawmill Creek, you will transfer to a waiting coach to continue your exploration by road.

Some walking is required on mostly level surfaces between modes of transportation and at all venues. Participants must negotiate a few steps with minimal assistance to (dis)embark the transportation and be capable of walking about 100 yards on hard surfaces. and anemones.

Keep an eye out for the local wildlife, including sea otters, whales and sea lions. Your captain is trained to approach animals in a way that will not disturb their natural behavior but can provide viewing and photo opportunities.

A **gourmet meal** awaits you upon arrival at **Fin Island Lodge**. Sit down to delicious Alaska crab and wild salmon cooked over an alder wood-fired grill. Also on the menu are prime rib, homemade side dishes and dessert. Coffee, tea, cocoa, lemonade and water are included. Alaska-brewed beers, wine and soft drinks are available for purchase.

You can relax next to the welcoming **beach fire**, explore the island or go beachcombing.

Return to Sitka by boat.

A breakfast twist on the signature Fin Island feast is offered for tours arriving before 10 am; vegan and gluten-free options are available. Dietary requests require at least 24 hours' notice. Wildlife viewing during the 20-minute ride may include eagles, sea lions, sea otters, whales and a variety of sea birds. You'll be introduced to Sitka's natural, geological, and cultural history en route to your guide's **residential floating house**. This is where you will gear up for the hike.

Then, it's a short ride across the bay to begin your **walk in the Tongass National Forest**. The first section is uphill through old-growth trees on trails that are not groomed but have been brushed out and widened. There are some slippery and steep areas with roots and

downed trees to step over and an open muskeg (boggy) area. You will reach the lake stocked with small and abundant trout (not trophy size).

Fly fishing or spin casting gear is provided for those who want to try their luck, along with bait and tackle. Inflatable **canoes** and a small dock for launching invite you to paddle along the shoreline. Alternatively, hike around the lake or hang out by the **campfire**. **Snacks and water** are provided here. You will spend 60 - 90 minutes at the lake; then, hike back to the floating house to gather your personal belongings, drop off the gear, and **boat** back to Sitka.

Notes:

Participants wishing to fish must purchase a license directly from the skipper (cash only). Terrain includes inclines and slippery surfaces. Participants must be in good physical shape and be prepared to hike for about 45 minutes each way to and from the lake. Minimum age is 7 years. Rubber boots, backpacks and fishing gear are provided. Another culinary highlight is the local **clam chowder** sourced from area shellfish. You'll stop at an atmospheric Sitka restaurant and enjoy rich chowder -- the essence of Alaska in a bowl -- along with other local treats.

One of the finest places to experience Alaska's fascinating Russian heritage is here in Sitka -- the former capital of Russian America. You'll stop by a new local restaurant to sample **pelmeni** -- a dish at the heart of Russian cuisine. This light and delicious dumpling is wrapped in a thin dough and is just spicy enough that you know you're trying something different. Choose either the meat or potato variety -- you can't go wrong.

Another only-in-Sitka experience is a visit to the **Alaska Pure Sea Salt Company**. Here,

you'll learn how founders Jim and Darcy Michener discovered that the surrounding crystal-clear waters produce perfectly flaked sea salt. They combined their passion for great food and wild places to create a product now used by some of the nation's top chefs. During your visit, you'll get to taste some locally-infused flavors, including Alder Smoked, Wild Blueberry and Sitka Spruce Tip.

No Alaska food experience is complete without sampling reindeer meat. In Sitka, you can try famous reindeer sausage hot dogs. You'll meet Chef Jo, who takes this experience to a whole new level with her creative twists on this local treat, such as a Mighty Mac n Cheese Dawg with white cheddar and smoky bacon bits. Or perhaps you would prefer the Hot Diggity Dawg with prosciutto, brie and caramelized onions. Whichever way you go, it's a flavor you won't forget and, with some creativity, you can replicate at home.

Bus transportation takes you to the trailhead of the **Starrigavin Muskeg Trail**. Set out from there **on foot** with a guide well-versed in Sitka's flora, fauna, and history and the surrounding area.

Enjoy great mountain views (weather permitting) as your **hike** begins with a gradual half-mile descent to Starrigavin Creek. From here, it is a half-mile level boardwalk through the Starrigavin Estuary bird viewing area. Cross the road and begin the 1.5-mile Mosquito Cove Loop Trail, gaining approximately 300 feet in elevation.

Walk along the beach back to Old Sitka and return to the pier.

Notes:

Restrooms are available at the Starrigavin Estuary bird viewing area. The entire hike is potentially four miles long and is for those in moderate shape; however, each group sets its own hiking pace, so the length of the hike may vary between two and four miles. Operates rain or shine. Water bottles are provided. Minimum age is 8 years. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair. This is a non-smoking tour. Wear comfortable walking shoes. Wildlife is plentiful here, and your skipper has a profound knowledge of the preferred habitats and movement of whales, sea otters, sea lions, porpoises, seals, brown bears and bald eagles. He also knows the best places to explore and **photograph** awe-inspiring volcanic formations, glacier-carved peaks, secluded passages and other natural wonders. Weather permitting, you may circumnavigate the rugged coast of St Lazaria National Wildlife Refuge -- breeding grounds for thousands of seabirds, including puffins, auklets and murre.

Weather permitting, you can **go ashore on remote islands** to beachcomb, explore tide pools, or just savor the peace of an untouched place.

Before you begin, gear up with state-of-the-art equipment for this extreme adventure. Don an exposure suit, a balaclava, safety glasses and gloves. The ocean raft gets you out into nature quickly with a blast of fresh air. Specially designed straddle seats provide comfortable and secure seating for this exciting trip out into nature.

This thrill ride takes you offshore into ocean waters to explore the ravaged **volcanic coastline of Kruzof Island**. This area makes for excellent photographic opportunities and is home to a variety of wildlife. It is common to spot whales, sea otters, Steller sea lions and sea birds, brown (grizzly) bears and Sitka black-tail deer from the raft. You will get close to the towering cliffs of St Lazaria Island -- a National Wildlife Refuge -- where sea birds nest.

In a volcanic **sea cave** (weather permitting),

the skipper will stop the boat and shut down the engine so you can listen to the surf crashing on the volcanic cliffs. You may be lucky enough to hear the song of nesting seabirds or whales breathing.

Head inside the state-of-the-art **Bald Eagle Flight Training Center** to observe eagles and other raptors in the final stages of rehabilitation before they are released back into the wild. Then, enjoy an **interactive presentation** where you meet a glove-trained

raptor. You'll fully appreciate up close the splendor and dramatic beauty of the resident raptors in their outside habitats.

Next, a short drive will take you to a covered, outdoor private dining area overlooking the harbor and Sitka Sound. Enjoy a delicious snack of fresh-caught, locally sourced salmon.

Not far away, the **Fortress of the Bear** provides the opportunity to get within 25 feet of Alaska's distinctive brown bear in a setting that closely replicates the animal's natural habitat. This three-quarter-acre habitat, located about seven miles from the town center, lies adjacent to the Tongass National Forest. Stand on the large, covered viewing platform to observe the bears and appreciate their individual personalities. Experienced naturalists share their love and knowledge of this often-feared yet shy and defensive creature of the forest.

The **oyster farm team** provides an engaging introduction to the facility, the oyster-growing process, and the cultivation of the shellfish from the width of a thumbnail to market size.

Get better acquainted with the thriving, prickly, smooth, slippery and slimy endemic marine wildlife of the clear and clean Southeast Alaska waters through the educational **hands-on touch tank**. Hear stories of life in a small Alaskan community.

Footage from an underwater drone gives you a feel for the ecosystem surrounding the oyster rafts and the oysters' food sources.

Lead with your taste buds at the on-site **floating Oyster Bar**, where you will sample freshly-harvested oyster and kelp products in a true ocean-to-table experience.

Browse in the **gift shop** before returning to the ship by boat and van.

Get behind the wheel of a **motorized Zodiac** boat and take off on an exhilarating adventure through **George Inlet Fjord**. Follow the lead guide caravan style as you **steer yourself** on a route tailored to the

day's conditions. This region has mountainous terrain, lush forest, and pristine scenery.

Your guide will share the rich stories of the loggers from the timber years and the nearby fishing camps. From the natural sounds of the flowing waterfalls to the hidden coves, keep your eyes open for active wildlife, including bald eagles, harbor seals, Sitka black-tail deer, black bears, and salmon streams.


Routes may vary upon the tide levels but can include a zip up to the mouth of Mahoney Glacial Cirque, Mahoney Asche Mine, Coon Cove, and White River Cove.

After cruising for 90 minutes, return to the cannery for **a flight of locally crafted beers and a snack** of cheese and reindeer sausage before returning to the ship.

Next, visit a **sour lime or papaya plantation** to learn what it takes to grow these local fruits. You'll also taste them right here on the farm. A *ranchero* (worker) tells you about cultivation techniques.

In the community of Armeria, you'll visit the Los Obradores **clay-brick factory**, where the bricks are mixed from clay in an age-old process, molded, dried and baked in the ovens. Finally, they are cooled and sold to the local construction industry, where they are in high demand. Clay is a favorite building material because of its insulating properties, which help to keep homes cool in the relentless heat.

Head to a local **beach restaurant** with a great view over the Pacific Ocean. A light **snack** is

served as you enjoy the breeze.

Delve into the sights and tastes of the Old Town on a sensory adventure. Cartagena's first **City Hall** is now home to the distinct

flavors and aromas of an exquisite Colombian staple -- coffee. Experienced baristas expound on the intricate art of **sublime coffee roasting**.

You'll have a few minutes to **shop for Emeralds** and to glimpse at **La Serrezuela** -- the city's former bullring transformed into a stunning shopping mall. **The Vaults (Las Bovedas)** was once a dungeon and prison but is now a lively marketplace seamlessly integrated into Cartagena's **UNESCO World Heritage Site City Walls**. Adventurous participants can climb atop the walls and catch a glimpse of one of its "lost" secret passageways.

Notes:

Active participation is required. Not advisable for guests using a wheelchair or for those with mobility limitations. Tour sequence may vary. Venues may be subject to change for operational reasons. Scenes of Cartagena with Less Shopping

This tour departs directly from the pier and explores the magnificent city of **Cartagena** -- one of the most important ports in colonial times for transporting gold and other precious cargo to Spain.

Drive through the residential area of Manga and admire the late-19th-century, Republican-style mansions.

Castillo San Felipe de Barajas Fort was Latin America's most important military structure and was built in the 17th and 18th centuries to defend the city.

One of Cartagena's more gruesome spectacles is Las Bovedas (**the dungeons**) in the Old City. Now, local artisans display their colorful and interesting arts and **handicrafts** here.

Visit **San Pedro Claver Church**, built in the 17th century. Inside, you'll see some exquisite statues and Old-World furnishings honoring the Patron Saint of Slaves.

Stop at **Inquisition Palace**, which served as a tribunal court and tried anyone the Church viewed as a heretic. The palace contains instruments of torture, along with documents, paintings and explanations about the Inquisition. Sentences handed down by the tribunal were generally not good news.

Notes:

Guests wishing to stay in town to shop or explore independently are welcome to do so but must make their own way back to the ship. Shade is limited; to avoid sunburn, wear light, long clothing suitable for use as a cover-up. Bring a hat and sunglasses; wear biodegradable sunscreen. Bring bottled water. The Old Town streets are cobblestone and are uneven in places.

Sky Kitchen Cooking Class

Prepare a delicious **lunch or dinner** in a kitchen custom-designed for cooking classes. Modern, spacious and well-ventilated, the facility features food prep stations, cooking islands and a dining area. Your fun and tasty **cooking class** starts with a brief introduction to Colombian cuisine and the meal you'll prepare. Learn how to make arepas stuffed with chicken or avocado and a second starter of fried plantains with shrimp and a tomato salsa topping.

The main dish is **fish baked in a Bijao tree leaf** -- a traditional cooking technique from the Colombian Amazon region. The result is a lean, juicy fish that is served with cassava. For dessert, you will prepare a typical sweet treat popular in Cartagena.

A homemade fresh **fruit drink** is served with

the main course; you can also purchase wine or beer (at your own expense).

Afterward, **walk** through **Cartagena's** narrow streets and plazas to explore the colonial walled city.

The class and menu can be adapted to vegetarian, celiac and lactose-intolerant ingredients. You must advise the shore excursions team prior to arrival in Cartagena. Wear comfortable walking shoes.

Your credit card will be charged immediately for all confirmed reservations. Should space become available for a waitlisted tours request, we will e-mail or otherwise contact you at that time and either immediately charge your credit card if you have already given us your credit card information or ask you to provide us with that information for immediate charge processing. Reservations for shore excursions are subject to cancellation by us at any time prior to the credit card charge being accepted by your bank. If you or Holland America cancel a tour (except Overland Adventures and Overnights) more than 3 days prior to cruise departure, we will issue a credit on the credit card that you used to pay for the reservation. For any cancellation within 3 days of departure, a credit will not be given on your credit card. - 30 - 60 days before tour date: 25%
- 14 - 29 days before tour date: 50%
- Within 14 days: Non-Refundable

Please note that the Cancellation Protection Plan covers pre-booked tours, including Overland Adventures and Overnights, if cancellation is made up to 24 hours prior to commencement of cruise. Tours cancelled within 24 hours prior to commencement of cruising or while on board are not covered by the Cancellation Protection Plan and are subject to the above penalties. In the event a complete tour is cancelled by Holland America Line or the tour operator, pre-booked refunds will be handled on board. Very shortly after each booking deadline/cancellation date, e-mails are sent from the ship to the agencies concerned, informing them of our definite requirements for meals, seats on aircraft, number of automobiles and motorcoaches, etc., and commitments are made. If notice of cancellation is received after the booking deadline/cancellation date, a refund can be assured only if the ticket is resold. Guests are encouraged to pre-purchase tours. We recommend speaking with the Shore Excursions Manager on board if you have any questions about your physical ability to take part in any tour. Should you opt not to take the tour following this discussion, full reimbursement will be made provided the cancellation is made within 24 hours of boarding the ship. For Overland Adventures and Overnights, due to the in-depth nature of the adventures, most areas are not accessible to wheelchairs and require a considerable amount of activity.



Scooters

Tours are subject to cancellations or changes. Tour operators reserve the right to deny participation to guests based on such criteria as they may establish. Children under 18 must be accompanied by a parent or responsible adult aged 21 years or older.
