

Punta del Este - Essentials

- In Port – 8 AM to 4 PM – 22 Jan 2025
- Tender Port
- La Pastora jetty – 10-15 min walk to tourist area
- Money - Uruguayan Peso (UYU) \$U – 40 UYU to 1 \$USD
- Safety – Normal Precautions
- No Visa Required
- Cell Service – All major providers
- Taxis – Uber is available – Taxi's accept UYU – maybe credit cards – ask. Verify meter use or negotiate fare upfront

Casapueblo



A dazzling white, Moorish-style complex on a rocky bluff overlooking the ocean, built by artist Carlos Paez Vilaró in 1958 using traditional tools. It serves as a home, workshop, and museum showcasing his art.

Why Visit: Iconic architecture, stunning coastal views, and cultural significance. Featured in HAL excursions like “Alto de la Ballena Winery” (photo stop) and “Punta del Este, Ralli Museum & Casapueblo” (interior visit).

Location: Punta Ballena, ~15-minute drive from the town center.



“La Mano” Sculpture - Brava Beach



Brava Beach is known for its powerful waves and the iconic “La Mano” (The Hand) sculpture by Mario Irarrázabal, depicting fingers emerging from the sand.

A must-see landmark included in the “Discover Punta del Este: Walking Tour” and “Punta del Este by Bike.” Walkable from the town center (~15-20 minutes from jetty).



General Artigas Square (Artisans' Square)



The vibrant heart of Punta del Este, named after Uruguay's national hero, with a statue and bustling market stalls selling local crafts, textiles, and souvenirs.

Featured in the "Discover Punta del Este: Walking Tour," it's in the town center, easily accessible from the jetty (~10-15 minute walk).

Location: Gorlero Avenue, town center.



Lighthouse

Description: A historic beacon built in 1860, guiding sailors and offering a glimpse into the city's maritime heritage.

Why Visit: Featured in the "Discover Punta del Este: Walking Tour" and "Punta del Este by Bike," it's walkable from the jetty (~10 minutes to town center, then a short stroll).


The chivito is a stacked sandwich featuring a thin, grilled beef steak (typically tenderloin), topped with mozzarella, lettuce, tomato, mayonnaise, and often bacon, ham, fried egg, and olives, served on a toasted bun or baguette. Its name, meaning “little goat” in Spanish, is a misnomer, as it’s made with beef, not goat, originating from a 1940s restaurant improvisation in Punta del Este.





Andes Museum

The Andes 1972 Museum (Museo Andes 1972) tells the story of Uruguayan Air Force Flight 571, which crashed in the Andes mountains in October 1972, and the 16 people who survived the crash for 72 days in the elements.
